



Though retailing is not a soft job, benefits can be gained if you enjoy what you're doing, Donald G. Soderquist, executive vice president of administration and distribution for Wal-Mart Stores Inc., said Monday.

Soderquist's lecture opened the Retailing Career Fair Symposium sponsored by the Center for Retailing Studies.

Soderquist said it is important for students to get involved in something they like, something they're in-

"A lot of people go into retailing for invalid reasons," Soderquist said. "If you're planning on going into re-tailing, you must ask yourself why you've chosen that field.'

He said one person out of every eight is employed in the field of re-

Many factors are involved which lead students to a field in retailing, Soderquist said. Students must ex-

requirements, he said.

Values also are important in making a judgement about a career field,
Soderquist said. Different values and standards will influence the area a person gets involved in, he said.

Another area which Soderquist recommends examining is one's idea of success. Many people are caught up in the idea of success meaning promotions and big dollars, he said.

"Don't use the world's guide of success as you're guide," Soderquist said. "Ask yourself what success means to you.

Soderquist discussed the pros and cons of retailing.

"Merchandising is fun," he said. "It is an area where you can express yourself and use your imagination to do things that have not been done before. There is also opportunity to make errors in the decision-making process. It's great be in a field where you can make errors and it doesn't blow you out.

Senate votes to extend prescription law

AUSTIN — The Senate voted Monday to re-enact a war-on-drugs bill that would a extend a 1981 law due to expire early next year.

Sen. Ray Farabée, D-Wichita Falls, said a 1981 law to stem forgeries of prescriptions for drugs such as

Quaaludes and amphetamines had been "a very effective deterrent."

The law requires the use of special triplicate prescription blanks issued by the Department of Public Safety. One copy is kept by the doctor, one by the pharmacy and the other goes to the DPS.

In the first year of the program according to written background material, pharmacies showed as percent decrease in prescriptions drugs "with a valid medical excess" but a high potential for abuse addition." Prescriptions fell an addition 13 percent the second year.
