Soviet space toilet tops U.S. system

JOHNSON SPACE CENTER, Houston — Toilet facilities are simpler and work better on Soviet spacecraft than aboard the American space shuttle, according to a French astronaut who flew aboard the Russian craft.

Frenchman Jean-Loup Chretien, who flew in the Soviet Salyut and Soyuz spacecraft, said the cosmonauts use a toilet system that uses air

to collect the solid waste in a bag. He told the Houston Chronicle the bag is then sealed, placed into a larger bag which is later put into a big aluminum can. When the can is filled, it is jettisoned into space.

For the space shuttle, the National Aeronautics and Space Administration spent \$12 million for a potty design by General Electric. As with the Soviet system, the shuttle toilet uses air pressure to collect the wastes, but processing and storage of the wastes is more complicated and less reli-

But in orbit, where there is no gravity, a new system had to be used.

The space shuttle toilet consists of a throne that draws air from the cabin. A user's backside is sealed to the seat and air pressure carries

away the waste matter.
At first, the shuttle toilet included a motor-driven slinger that was to break up the solid waste particles and distribute them on the insides of the bowl. The matter was then freeze-dried and the resulting dust carried away by air pressure.

Astronauts complained on flight

after flight that the system failed, often resulting in a tan haze inside the space cabin. The toilet also froze during one flight, and on another mission an astronaut had the un-pleasant task of cleaning a tube jammed with a putty-like brown


