**Jury picked for Mattox bribery trial**

AUSTIN — An eight-member four-man jury was picked Wednesday to decide whether General Jim Mattox is guilty of commercial bribery.

After jury selection was completed, State District Judge Thurman recessed the trial until Monday, when the prosecution will try to prove that Mattox threatened to block a Houston firm's bond business.

Jury selection was completed one day.

Travis County District Judge Ronnie Earle conducted the selection during the morning session while Roy Minton, chief attorney for Mattox, took over in the afternoon.

Thirteen had already been missed from the case.

Five said they had already made up their minds about the case, other said he had hired Mattox's lawyer in another case.

One man said he was overwhelmed by all the activity, crowds and the TV cameras, and not think he could make a logical decision.

Still another turned out to be an investigator on Earle's staff.

Mattox was indicted in September 1983, accused of threatening to leave the Houston law firm of Fulbright & Jaworski out of the municipal business unless one of its partners, Tom McDade, dropped efforts to question Mattox's sister in connection with a lawsuit involving state, South Texas Rancher Co., Manges and Mobil Oil Corp.

Fulbright & Jaworski represented Mobil Oil in the case, which was tried last year.

McDade will be the first prosecution witness presented.

Miss Texas A&M Pageant

**Not just a beauty contest**

The Miss Texas A&M Scholarship Pageant is not a beauty contest, said Miss Texas A&M Kim Walters at Sully's Symposium Wednesday.

"Pageants aren't just meat shows," Walters said.

The pageant provides scholarships for women with strong academic and athletic abilities, as well as those talented in other areas, she said.

The winner must be poised, intelligent, talented and physically fit.

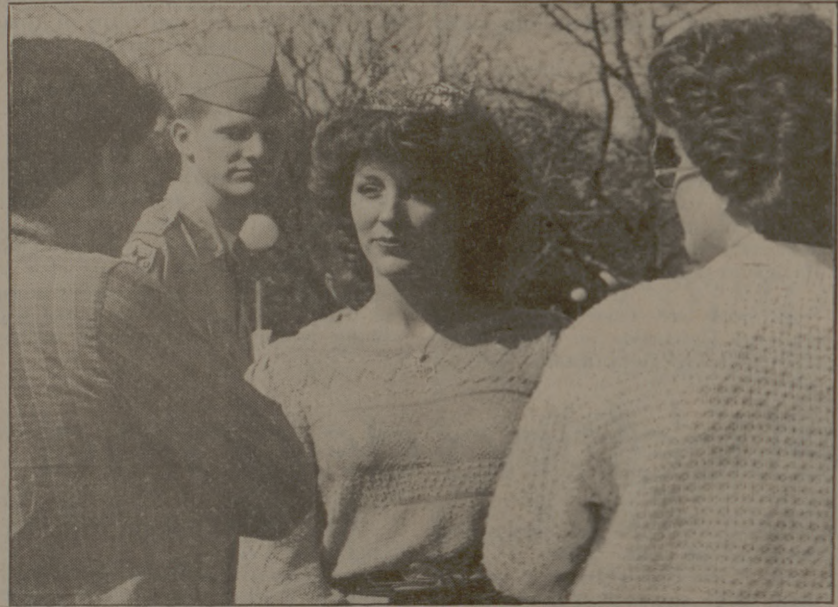
"The swimsuit competition, for example, is not to see if a girl just has a good figure," she said. "It's to see if she is confident and proud enough to be physically fit, as well as poised enough to walk on a stage in a swimsuit."

Walters said only 25 percent of judging is devoted to the evening gown and swimsuit competitions. The interviews with the 20 finalists account for 25 percent of the judging totals.

"The interview can be really involved," she said. "It can cover such subjects as current events, controversial issues or Aggie traditions."

Intelligence is an important factor, Walters said. Past winners such as Sherri Ryman have had grade-point ratios as high as 3.8 on a scale of 4.0.

Some of the benefits that Walters received as Miss Texas A&M include the use of a maroon and white Cadillac and a \$3,000 Texas-shaped diamond and gold pendant. The pendant will be passed down to the winner of this year's pageant.

Walters said she thinks Miss Texas A&M is important to the University because she is the only visual female representative.

"I didn't want to set myself apart," Walters said. "Sometimes it's hard for a student leader to remember they're just another student."

Walters also discussed the fact that the Miss Texas A&M Scholarship Pageant is completely student-planned by the Memorial Student Center Hospitality committee.

The pageant is produced on a

professional level, Walters said. The choreography and set design, as well as the advertising and overall planning, are done by student volunteers.

Walters said Miss Texas A&M has prestige at the Miss Texas Pageant because of the support from students and former students.

A&M is also the only major school in Texas to send a contestant to the Miss Texas Pageant.

This year's pageant will be Feb. 23 at 7 p.m. in Rudder Auditorium.
