## No. 9 Tigers edge past Aggie netters

Texas A&M's 11th-ranked men's tennis team dropped only its second dual-match of the spring season, losing to No. 9 Trinity University, 5-4, Tuesday.

Going in to yesterday's match in San Antonio, A&M, now 9-2 overall, had never defeated the perennially powerful Trinity Tigers. But Coach David Kent's Aggies came about as close as you can get to upsetting their first Top 10 team of the season.

Just how close were they? After the six singles matches, the Aggies were tied with the Tigers, 3-3, with only the three doubles matches remaining.

But in the last game of the last set of No. 2 doubles, A&M's duo of Mark Smith and Russ Simmons came up shy against Trinity's Chris Kennedy and Grayson Underwood, who disposed of the Ags, 6-3, 3-6, 7-5.

"It was just a heck of a tennis match all the way around and some fine collegiate tennis," Kent said. "We thought we had a good chance to win it once we were tied after the singles matches."

"I guess it's probably my fault that we lost, though. I just don't really know."

Kent said the Tiger's large partisan crowd, something which the Ags aren't accustomed to playing in front of, might have rattled the team somewhat. However, Kent was still disappointed with a few player's performances during the match.

"(Trinity) gets real excited about its tennis," he said. "They have some pretty volatile fans down there and they get pretty loud, but (Grant) Connell, (Marcel) Vos and (Dean) Johnson were really the only one's that played well. The rest of the guys didn't play as well as they should have, considering the competition."

"I really feel we should've won the match."

A&M can't allow the loss to Trinity to linger in its memory too long. The Aggies take on a tough Northeast Louisiana team Thursday at 1:30 p.m. at the Omar Smith Tennis Center.

"We had better bounce back from this (loss to Trinity)," Kent said. "Northeast Louisiana comes in here Thursday and they always play us tough. Maybe I'll have to revise the singles and doubles alignments before then and see how that goes."
