Prof speaks about pornography

Dr. Wendy Stock, a Texas A&M psychology professor, expressed concern about the relationship between pornography and violence to-ward women at the monthly meeting of the Brazos County National Organization for Women Tuesday night.

Stock's speech included a slide presentation of pictures and adver-ranging from Vogue to Penthouse to hardcore publications such as Hus-tler and Gallery.

Stock, a Texas A&M psychology professor 'The focus in these magazines is on male sexual gratification, not that there is anything wrong with that, but there should be more equality,"

Stock said. Young boys learn from sexually explicit magazines, she said.

Stock attributes the increase in vi-

olent pornography to two things. One is that people get bored see-ing the same old thing. The other is that since men haven't adjusted to the social and economic strides women have made they still can pick up a copy of Penthouse magazine and see a woman being degraded. Supposedly this makes the man feel superior.

Student Senate to conside horse racing, library funds

A bill calling for the Texas A&M Student Senate to support parimutuel betting and horse racing will be introduced during the Senate's meeting tonight. A resolution recommending

that \$1,700 be transferred from the Student Service Fee Reserve Account to the Sterling C. Evans Library also will be introduced.

The library resolution specifies that the money would be used to fund the expansion of library hours. In explanation of the recommendation, it says that the library administration had an-nounced that it could not fund the planned expansion of library hours because of expected University budget cuts.
