Core curriculum public hearing set

A public hearing by the Faculty Senate on the proposed core curriculum will be Thursday from 3 p.m.-4:30 p.m. in 501 Rudder.

Senator Sam Black, chairman of the academic affairs committee, said the hearing, the first of three scheduled for this semester, will provide a forum for students, faculty and staff to express their support or concern for the proposal.

The committee recommends each student complete six hours of speech and writing skills, mathematical and logical reasoning, cultural heritage, and social science. The committee also recommends eight hours of science.

Other recommendations will require each student entering the University to have completed at least one computer science course showing proficiency by passing an examination.

In addition, each student entering the University will also be required to have completed two years of a foreign language or prove proficiency through an examination.

Since the Senate isn't required to be present, Black said, a record transcript will be available to the senators.

The final recommendation on the proposal isn't until late spring, early summer, Black said. If the proposal is accepted, it won't be applicable to students for several years.

Border searches are criticized by senators

AUSTIN — Texas border senators said Tuesday that car-by-car searches by the federal government at the United States-Mexico border had helped to wreck the economy of that region.

Three senators sponsored a resolution stating the Texas Senate's "express displeasure" with the "officious actions" of the U.S. Drug Enforcement Administration in conducting the searches.

The resolution, which was approved on voice vote, said the searches to "halt the insidious drug smuggling" across the border had paralyzed traffic at 15 border crossings.

"This, coupled with the peso devaluation, has completely shattered the economy of your border cities," said Sen. Tati Santiesteban, D-El Paso, a border city of 500,000.

Santiesteban said "to add insult to injury" immigration officials were checking only Mexican passengers. "Allegedly, they are searching for the (federal drug official) victim that was kidnapped in Guadalajara," he said.

"Now, I make a living, you realize, defending people accused of crimes, and I cannot tell you the laughter that is being created by those in the underworld," said Santiesteban.

Sen. Hector Uribe, D-Brownsville, said he, too, had heard that DEA Administrator Francis Mullen was trying to send a message to Mexican officers at Guadalajara, and the message was, "We decry your lack of cooperation in our efforts to locate and prosecute those who have kidnapped agents of the DEA — shame on you."

"It's a good message," Uribe said, but he added, "Senators, whatever the message is, it's being sent to the wrong address. I don't know why being sent to border merchants and shoppers and cousins on both sides of the border."

"And by the way, Mr. Mullen of the DEA, Guadalajara is in Mexico — and by the way Mr. Mullen, every border has two sides."

Sen. John Traeger, D-Seguin, whose district includes the border city of Laredo, said of the resolution, "It is not possible for the Texas Senate to censure the Drug Enforcement Administration of the United States government, but by this resolution we are going as far as we can to censure them — to tell them, thoughtless, how totally irresponsible their actions were."
