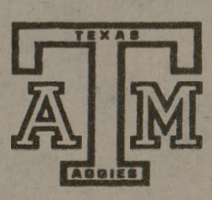

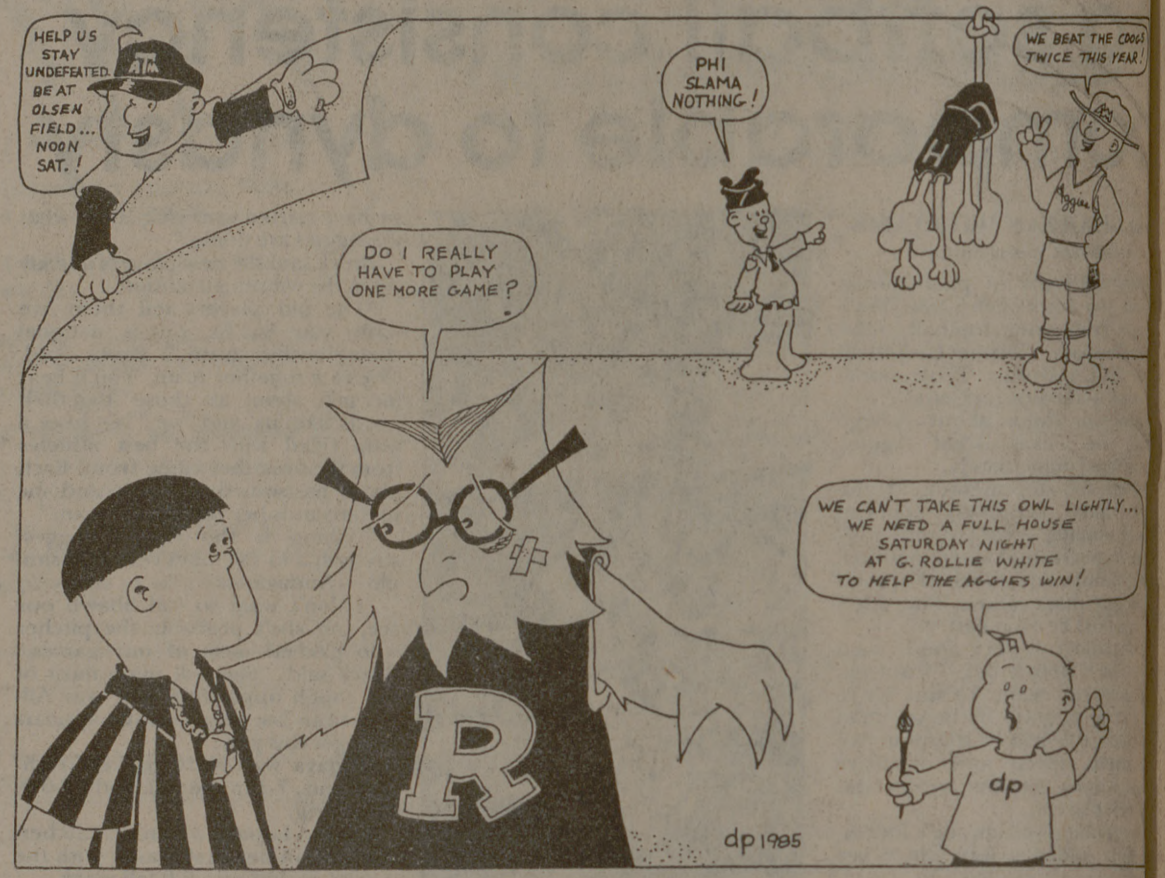

Nationals await A&M pistol team

"We've got the toughest early schedule we've ever had," Brock said. "We're going to California on our spring break. That will be our toughest competition. The California teams seem to have a stronger approach to the game, but everyone is getting tough."

"We look for Cal State-Fullerton to be after us. They have the re-

venge factor. Last year was the first time they weren't in the World Series because we knocked them off."

Brock said the early tests could make the team much stronger by the end of the year.

"I think the players understand they have to get into their game quicker," Brock said. "This will push them to the maximum. I think we will stay at that level. This is the op-

posite of what I usually do."

After two national championships and a second place finish, are the Aggies establishing a dynasty?

"As a coach I would say no," Brock said. "It's just a continuation of the winning attitude of Texas A&M. Everybody that comes here gets that maroon blood in the A&M, itself, is a dynasty. It takes special student to even come here."
