

Cadets to lift off to maneuvers


It may look like a scene out of "Apocalypse Now," but when six Chinook helicopters land on the Texas A&M soccer field Saturday morning it will be the beginning of a more peaceful event — the Corps of Cadets on maneuver.

About 125 cadets will participate in the maneuvers this weekend at Camp Swift, a National Guard re-

serve near Bastrop. Capt. Gilbert Collins, operations officer with the Corps of Cadets, said the purpose of the maneuvers is to prepare junior and senior contract cadets for their six weeks of said. training camp at Fort Riley, Kan. this summer.

Cadets with a contract, Collins said, will be commissioned as a second lieutenant either for active duty or in the reserves after graduation.

or in the reserves after graduation. The cadets will gather in Parking Annex 21 behind the Military Sci-ences Building at 9:30 a.m. Satur-day, Collins said. landings caught many people by surprise


