Two guards suspended pending results of escape investigation

TENNESSEE COLONY — Two prison guards are on suspension pending the outcome of an investigation into the escape of a convicted rapist who is still at large, a Texas Department of Corrections spokes-

TDC spokesman Phil Guthrie said the investigation does not indicate

the two guards were paid or participated in the escape. However, they may have known that Bevan was planning to flee, he said. Neither guard has been charged.

Both officers were earlier linked to the escape when the Anderson County Sheriff's Department as-sisted a TDC search of the officers' Palestine mobile home.

A sheriff's department report says
