

A&M starts season off with bang

Ag softball team wins Mardi Gras tourney

After two national championships, you should expect only the best out of the Texas A&M women's softball team.

However, who could or would have expected the Aggies to shut out their opponents 38-0 in their first tournament of the spring season?

The Aggies did just that over the weekend at the Mardi Gras Championship Tournament in Houma, La.

"I didn't expect for us to shut everyone out," said Aggie second baseman Mary Schwind. "We just worked well together. We are playing very good right now. Everything is clicking."

The stars in the seven-game tournament were numerous for the Aggies.

Schwind, shortstop Liz Mizera and pitcher Shawn Andaya were selected to the all-tournament team. Andaya was the tourney's most valuable pitcher and Mizera was the most valuable hitter.

In the championship game, Andaya tossed a two-hitter as A&M blanked Louisiana Tech 5-0. Mizera knocked in two runs and Schwind had two hits.

A&M got to the championship game by downing Baylor in a surprisingly close game. The 1-0 win produced even different heroes.

Yvette Lopez pitched a three-hitter and Josi Carter had the game-winning hit.

"Baylor played surprisingly well," pitcher Karen Athanacio said. "Their pitcher was slower which threw some of our players off."

Cindy Cooper had two RBIs and Judy Trussell had a pair of hits in a 7-0 pasting of Missouri in the first game. Andaya struck out 10 to pick up the win.

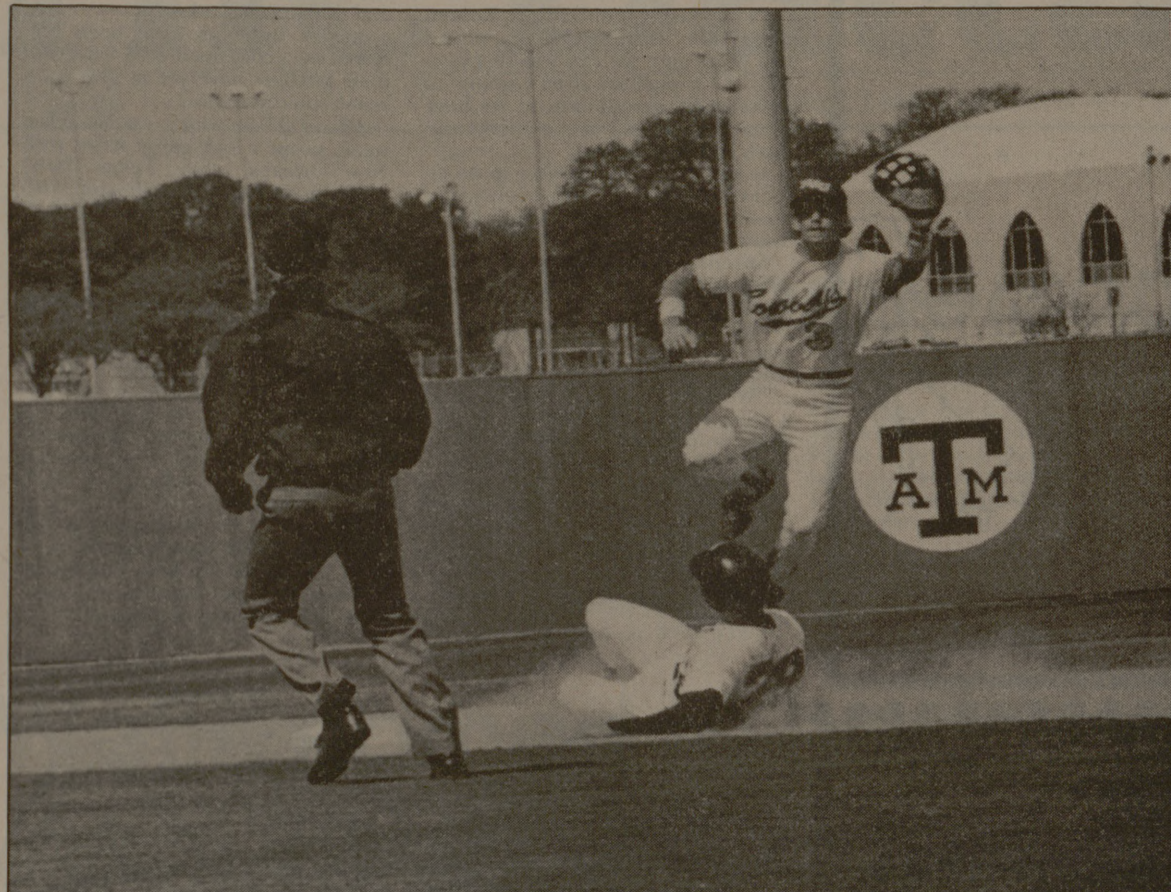
Athanacio pitched two no-hitters over the weekend. She fanned six in a 5-0 win over St. Louis and shut out Evansville 14-0.

"It was good," Athanacio said. "I was kind of happy. I changed some things which helped my pitching. I want to do a lot better though."

over Sam Houston State and Southwestern Louisiana.

Schwind said the Aggies should be better than last season, when they lost to UCLA in the NCAA final, because of the depth they have this year.

powers as Cal-State Fullerton, Cal-State Berkley, Fresno State and the University of the Pacific.

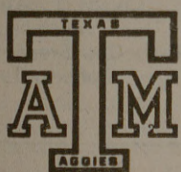

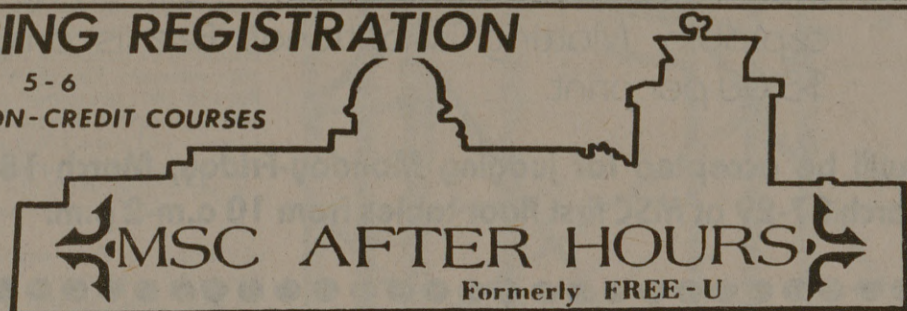
