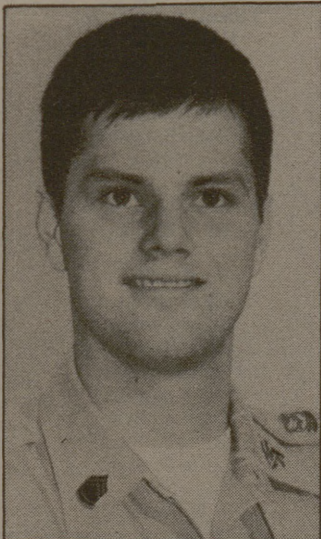

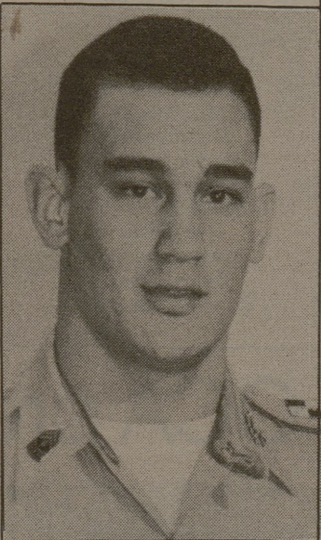


Thomas "Pre" Ball

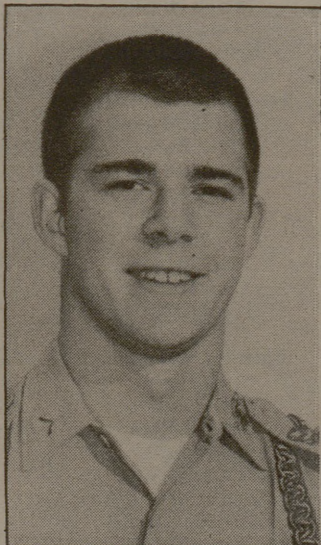
I see the position of class president as one of importance in the sense of the size of our class and the responsibility of representing this large and diversified constituency. This responsibility cannot be taken lightly.

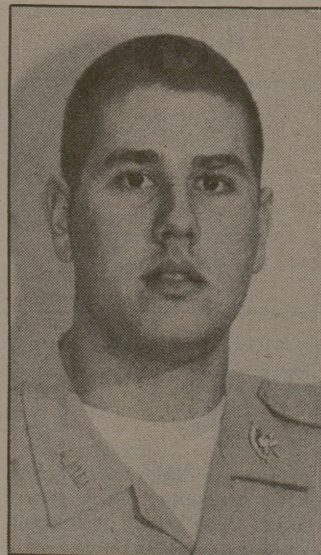
