FORT WORTH — Investigators have turned up at least 10 new felony crimes attributed to a student vigilante group known as the Legion of Doom, a police spokesman said.

Spokesman Doug Clarke said Monday an arson investigator and two members of the police gang unit

Last week, police said they were investigating around 30 acts of violence, including a car bombing.

According to police, the Legion of Doom consists of about nine students at Paschal High School, including athletes and honor students. The group engaged in acts of vio-lence and intimidation in an attempt to rid their campus of drugs, crime

Two students and a recent Paschal graduate were free on bond last week following their arrests in the investigation of a pipe bomb that exploded in a student's car on March 24.

Police suspect Legion members of nave been assigned to help the sergeant and two detectives already working on the case.

"More felony offenses are turning up," Clarke said Monday. "We're looking at between 10 and 15 new offenses."


