

U.S. official: Gorbachev has agreed to summit

WASHINGTON — Soviet leader Mikhail S. Gorbachev has "agreed in principle" to a summit meeting with President Reagan, but the time and place still must be worked out, a senior U.S. official said Tuesday.

Two possible sites and times are Helsinki, Finland, in August, and the United Nations in New York in September, the official, who insisted on anonymity, told The Associated

It would be the first U.S.-Soviet summit since 1979, when former President Jimmy Carter and the late Leonid I. Brezhnev signed the sec-ond Strategic Arms Limitation Treaty (SALT II) to reduce some

BEIRUT, Lebanon - The Israe army began closing the Ansar pris camp in southern Lebanon on Tu day and the military command as more than 600 of the prisone would be released.

Israeli radio reported that 1.20 of the Shiite Moslem and Palestina prisoners at Ansar were being tra erred to Israel and the camp mantled as part of the second plas of the Israeli withdrawal from La

The military command in Aviv said the prisoners being mo were "being temporarily transfer to a detention facility in Israel." Lt. Gen. Moshe Levy, the Israe chief of staff, told Israel radio la more than 600 prisoners will be leased starting Wednesday.

An army announcement gested other prisoners might be eased if Shiite Moslem attacks on raeli soldiers diminished. The am "will release the detainees in accor ance with developments in sou Lebanon" as the army withdraw the announcement said.

The Israelis invaded Lebanon in 1982 and Israeli troops are expedito complete their withdrawal by a May or early June. The Shiite Mo lems have stepped up attacks on Israelis. About 220 attacks on Isrselis in March killed 19 israelis soldiers. Two Israeli soldiers w killed in the first two days of Aprill guerrilla ambushes and bombs




