

State fees, tuition hike package falls short of balancing budget

AUSTIN — The House Appropriations Committee on Wednesday backed off its previous proposal to raise the annual motor vehicle inspection fee from \$5.25 to \$10.

Overall, the committee voted final bill. "It's just a matter of time." approval to a fee-hike package of about \$120 million, far short of what's needed for a balanced bud-

If the fee bill and a college tuition hike bill win legislative approval, the appropriations bill as tentatively ap-

proved by the committee would leave the state about \$72 million short, according to Ron Lindsey of the Legislative Budget Board.
