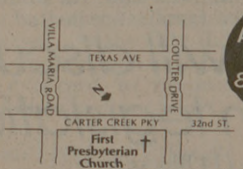

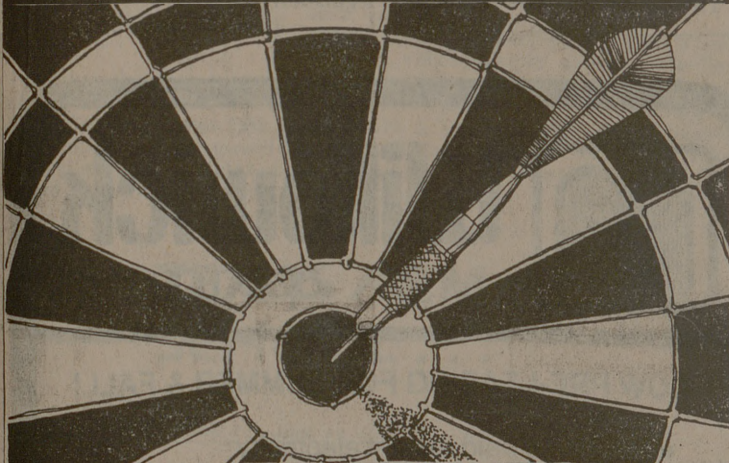

MSC council offers leadership training

Freshman interested in learning leadership skills, organizational skills and goal setting can now go to the Council Assistant Program for help.

The Council Assistant Program offers training for future leadership opportunities, said Camille Clark, program director.

Memorial Student Center Council officers will oversee the training along with council advisers.

"The big thing now is learning how to work in a team," Clark said. "I think it is the best route to learn about the MSC and the University. You get to meet really neat people."

An informational meeting was held Wednesday, but applications can still be picked up in 216 MSC. Applications must be returned by Friday.

The letters introducing the program were sent to freshmen with at least a 3.25 grade-point ratio, Clark said. However, a 3.25 GPR is not a

requirement to participate in the program, she said.

Any student interested may turn in an application.

A committee will select 80 students on the basis of their applications.

Those 80 will be interviewed Tuesday and Wednesday by the MSC council officers who will then choose 30 students to participate in the Council Assistant Program.

The students will be divided into one of six areas: finance, operations, public relations, programming, development and student development.

The students will aid the MSC vice presidents in each area.

Although they will be working in their assigned areas, the students will meet as a group once a month.

As for the program itself, Clark said it will take a lot of time.

"They get hands-on experience," Clark said. "They are by no means not seen. They get a lot of credit."

Casualties excluded from war memorial

WASHINGTON — The Vietnam Veterans Memorial Fund will try to find room on the Vietnam Veterans Memorial for names of casualties inadvertently left off because they died outside the official combat zone, Paul Lee, executive assistant to U.S. Sen. Don Nickles, said Wednesday.

"They have the veterans' best interest at heart," said Lee after meeting with Jan Scruggs, president of the memorial fund. "They want to try to be as inclusive as possible. If they find more combat casualties, they want to put them on the memorial."

The long, black marble wall — built with donations — is the first U.S. war memorial to list all the dead

or missing. It is currently inscribed with 58,022 names gleaned from official lists of combat casualties.

Presidents Johnson and Nixon issued directives designating the official combat zone, which first included only Vietnam and surrounding waters and later included Cambodia and Laos.

The Department of Defense now says there are "at least 330" who died outside the designated combat zone, but were on combat missions and should be listed on the memorial.

Nickles, R-Okla., became involved when Leo Broadhead of Edmond, Okla., complained that his son's name was left off the marble memorial.
