

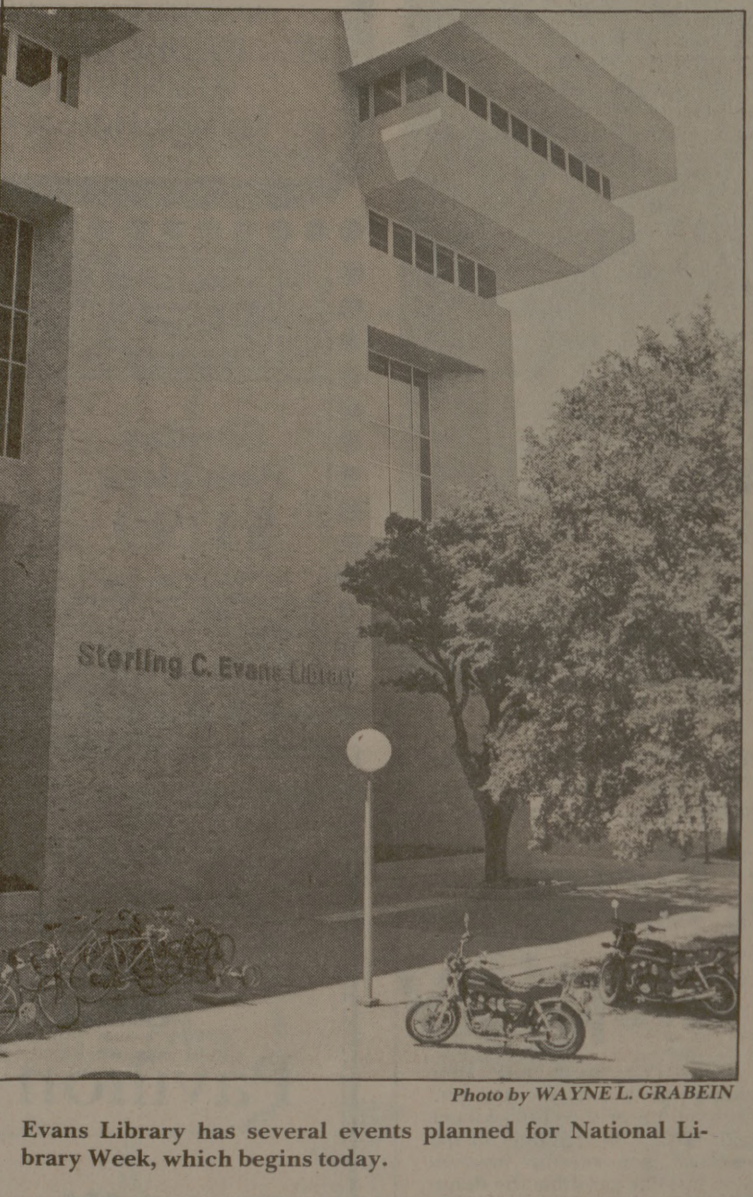

Library to celebrate this week



Evans Library has several events planned for National Library Week, which begins today.

National Library Week will be celebrated at Sterling C. Evans Library this week with several events including speeches, a book sale and an awards ceremony.

Activities are sponsored by the Friends of Sterling C. Evans Library and are coordinated by the National Library Week Committee.

Lori Bronars, chairman of National Library Week committee for Sterling C. Evans, said people drift in and out of the library, but some of the activities will attract their attention.

"Most people will glance at some of the activities," Bronars said, "and hopefully they will be interested and stay for a while."

John Bloom, a columnist for the Dallas Times Herald, will give a speech Tuesday at 3 p.m. in the northeast alcove on the second floor of the library. Bloom is the author of the recently published book, "Evidence of Love" and has been a reporter for Texas Monthly. A reception at 4 p.m. in room 204B of the library will follow the speech.

Mary Moore, a reference librarian for social sciences, said that because Bloom is a relatively well-known columnist, she thinks many people will be interested in seeing him.

"John Bloom is a recognized journalist," Moore said. "He should attract a fairly large audience."

The Longevity Awards ceremony for library faculty and staff

will be Wednesday at 2 p.m. in room 204C of the library. The library will honor those who have worked 10, 15, 20 or 30 years at the library. A reception will be held in room 204B.

On Thursday three laser movies will be shown in the sunken reading room on the second floor. The movies will run continuously starting with "North by Northwest" at 10 a.m., "Alcan Queen" at 12:15 p.m. and "Forbidden Planet" at 2 p.m.

Bronars said the movies probably will attract a large audience.

"The movies will attract a variety of people because there are three different types of movies," she said.

The annual book sale will be Friday from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m. on the south side of the library. About 2,000 books ranging from musical scores to authentic Chinese works will be on sale. The price of a hardcover book is \$1, a softcover is 25 cents and a magazine is 20 cents.

Moore, who is in charge of the book sale, said most of the books are gifts from people. She said the library agrees to sell the books because they already have enough copies of them.

"If the library already has three or four copies of a book then it has no need for any more, so we sell them," she said.

Other library workers who assisted in National Library Week include Jacque Halverson, who is in charge of displays; Laura Blas-Tull, who is in charge of publicity; and Sandy Tucker, who organized the reception for Bloom.

5th artificial heart operation not easy

 LOUISVILLE, Ky. — Doctors had an unexpectedly difficult time implanting a mechanical heart in Jack C. Burcham on Sunday because his chest cavity was smaller than anticipated, a medical spokesman said.

hardest technically," Dr. Allan M. Lansing, chairman of Humana Heart Institute International, said of the 6-hour operation.
 Lansing said the retired railroad worker's life never was threatened, despite the "maneuvering and positioning" of the artificial heart by im-

plant surgeon William C. DeVries. Burcham's vital signs were good and he was expected to spend several hours sleeping off his anesthetic in the coronary care unit.
 Lansing said Burcham's surgery seemed to bear out the theory that the Jarvik-7 cannot be implanted in

a person smaller than about 150 pounds. Burcham's weight was 140 pounds.
 Margaret Schroeder, whose husband, William, received a Jarvik-7 heart in November, visited members of the Burcham family briefly Sunday morning.
