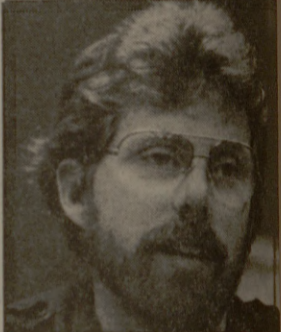

Obscenity OK in stories says local sci-fi writer

It's OK to use obscenity in a science fiction story, but only if it's necessary to the story, Steve Gould, a Bryan science fiction writer, told about 20 people at an MSC Cepheid Variable meeting Monday night. "I'm serious about this," he said. "I've had my writing compared by one critic as barely left of Walt Disney." Gould has been nominated for a Hugo Award for "Rory," a short story published in the April 1984 issue of Analog magazine. The winner will be decided by science fiction fans at the World Science Fiction Convention in September. Gould said he received a letter from a man who read "Rory" complaining about the use of a four-letter word in the story. "This upset me," Gould said. "It also amused me greatly." He said there is no reason to avoid

profanity, because it is used everyday in real life. For example, he said it is used in the Corps of Cadets all the time. "Do you portray life or ignore the language completely?" he asked. "Do you put in gosh or go for the astericks and underlines, which I feel is silly?" Gould said he used the four-letter in his story because the characters were facing a life and death situation. "People tend to use that language in that situation," he said. Gould said most science fiction magazine editors approve of obscene words do exist and realize of their use only if they are used for shock or emphasis in the story. He also read the prologue and the first chapter of "The Glass Helm," a novel he is trying to sell. The novel examines what education does to keep civilization intact. Gould said his Hugo Award nomination may increase his chances of selling the

novel. "Mental Blocks," a short story at a university, will be published in the July issue of Amazing magazine. Three of his short stories have been published by Analog and Isaac Asimov's Science Fiction Magazine. Gould attended Texas A&M from 1973-78 and 1981-84. He was a member of Aggie Con VI in 1976.

KAMU auctions unique items through Thursday

Bids will be taken through Thursday for about 570 items ranging from a stuffed dog to a Texas Instruments portable computer at an auction to raise money for KAMU-TV, Channel 15. Every night since Friday, KAMU staff along with 40-50 volunteers from the community have been on the air auctioning merchandise donated by local businesses. All proceeds from the auction will go to KAMU, a public broadcasting station, to help pay for the forth-

coming season's programming, which will cost about \$130,000, says Station Manager Rodney Zent. This year's auction is the biggest of four fund raisers for programming. "Our goal is to raise \$50,000 from this auction," Zent says. There are a variety of items, with a minimum bid of \$35 each, that are being auctioned. Some of the items are a four-wheeled motorcycle, gift certificates from several restaurants and even an electric fire ant killer. Thus far, this year's auction has not been as successful as last years, but Zent says he hopes that the dif-

ference will be made up before the end of the week. The auction items can be seen at Channel 15 from 7 p.m. until 11 p.m. All merchandise that is purchased must be paid for with cash, MasterCard or Visa, no later than one week after the bid is made. Zent says some of the proceeds that KAMU plans to buy for the coming season are the McLeh Lehrer News Hour, which costs \$25,804; Nova, which costs \$18,500 and Sesame Street, which costs \$13,162. All of the prices are for full year of programming.
