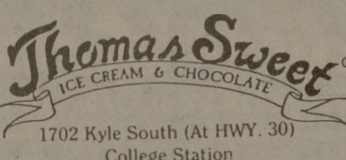

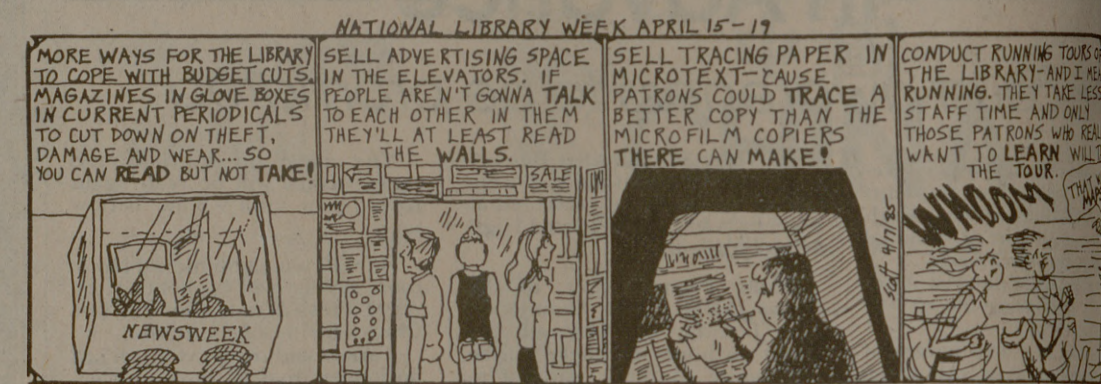

Warped

CRIME STOPPERS

AMARILLO — Jose Madera Rios has a cross and the name "Lilly" tattooed on his left forearm.

It was the name of his wife. Now Rios, 27, has made the Texas Most Wanted list for the 1984 murder of Lilly Rios.

Amarillo Police Department investigators say Lilly Rios, 21, was shot to death on February 12, 1984, during a family disturbance at her residence. At the time of the shooting, Jose and Lilly Rios were estranged.

Rios was arraigned for his wife's murder and posted bond. When he failed to appear for trial, a warrant was issued for his arrest. To compound his problems, Rios also was named in a mandate, ordering his return to prison for five years on a theft charge.

This week the Texas Crime Stoppers Advisory Council is offering a \$1,000 reward for information leading to the capture of Rios.

He is 5 feet 3 inches tall, 140 pounds, with black hair and brown

eyes. He sometimes wears a scraggly beard and speaks broken English.

In the past, Rios has used the name Juan Antonio Chavez-Zamora.

He has worked at various dealerships and body shops as a mechanic.

Anyone with information concerning Rios' whereabouts is asked to call Texas Crime Stoppers toll-free at 800-252-8477 or their local Crime Stoppers program. Callers do not have to reveal their identities.

Texas Most Wanted is a cooperative effort of Texas Crime Stoppers and the Department of Public Safety. It is designed to enlist the assistance of citizens in obtaining information about the location of dangerous fugitives.

R-Conn., to reduce U.S. economic links to South Africa.

The proposal would prohibit new U.S. investment in South Africa, the sale of computers to that country and the import of South African gold coins, known as Kruggerands.

Sen. John Heinz, R-Pa., said "there is a substantial amount of bipartisan support" in Congress this year for some type of anti-apartheid measure.

Weicker said the South African government "will only trust the sincerity of our opposition to apartheid

when we back it up with economic sanctions."

Kennedy, alluding to South Africa's decision on Monday to repeal laws banning interracial marriage, described the measure as "too little, too late."

litation affects. But the senate's real work is done "behind closed doors," Thode says.

"Most of the time our bills will deal with something that informal meetings have been going on about," Thode says. "Most of our legislation deals with things that we already know will change."

Wayne Roberts, Student Government's former vice president of student services, says the organization has been responsible for establishing many student services.

"Student Government was responsible for getting the full-time legal advisers, extended library hours,

more counselors for the student counseling office, the Nautilus weight-lifting equipment in G. Rollie White, intra-campus shuttle bus and a long list of other things," Roberts says. "The idea for these programs started in Student Government."

Student Government has had a great impact on issues that affect student services but has faltered on academic issues, Thode says.

"On academic issues, you could say we have faltered," he says. "We have faltered because we haven't done our homework. If we don't have something thoroughly researched, we're not going to have any impact."

Royal says students have impacted the Texas A&M Board of Regents through the Chancellor-Student Advisory Board.

Michael O'Quinn, a member of the advisory board, says the group composed of students from schools in the Texas A&M University System.

Though the advisory board offers information on an informal basis, the Board of Regents has been receptive to their ideas, O'Quinn says.

The advisory board is two years old and hasn't had time to build a real working relationship with the regents, O'Quinn says.

Justice Thurgood Marshall, in an opinion joined by Justice William J. Brennan, said Burger's opinion went too far. The opinion "thwarts congressional efforts to balance the public's interest in information and the government's need for secrecy," Marshall said.

A congressional committee and a presidential commission investigated the CIA project in the mid-1970s, shedding light on numerous abuses in an effort that involved at least 80 institutions and 185 private researchers.

In other cases, the high court:

- Ruled unanimously that Indian tribes may tax mineral, oil and gas leases on tribal lands without the federal government's approval. In a case involving Navajo lands in Arizona, New Mexico and Utah, the court said the taxes do not require approval by the Interior secretary.
- Struck down an 84-year-old provision of the Alabama Constitution that denied the right to vote to anyone convicted of crimes of "moral turpitude." The court said the voting ban was aimed at least in part at blacks.
