Comedy play scheduled to begin tonight

The performances, all of which begin at 8 p.m., are scheduled for tonight, Friday and Saturday. The special performance Wednesday will benefit the College of Liberal Arts and the theater arts department. The play's three final performances are on April 25, 26 and 27.

Investing money more complex

NEW YORK — Investing used to be simple — but not very profitable. Most people would take their money to the bank, squirrel it away in a low interest paying account and forget about it. Not anymore. In today's radically changed money world, the job of managing
