

Astros 'rain' over Expos; Tiger homers zap Texas

Astros 3, Expos 1

MONTREAL — Bob Knepper and Bill Dawley combined on a five-hitter in pitching the Houston Astros to a 3-1 victory over the Montreal Expos Tuesday night in a game interrupted for almost two hours by rain.

Knepper, 3-0, allowed only two hits in 5 1/3 innings before Hubie Brooks stroked a single as rain began to fall. After a one-hour, 46-minute rain delay, Dawley came out of the bullpen and allowed a single to Terry Francona which skipped past left fielder Jose Cruz for an error that allowed Brooks to score.

That was all the offense Montreal could manage against Dawley, who worked 3 2/3 innings for his first save.

Cubs 4, Dodgers 2

CHICAGO — Davey Lopes had two singles and a sacrifice fly and drove in two runs to lead the Chicago Cubs to a 4-2 victory over the Los Angeles Dodgers Tuesday.

Lopes, who struck out four times in Monday's loss to his former teammates, drove in one run with a third-inning sacrifice fly and singled in another in the sixth.

Dick Ruthven, 1-1, allowed eight hits and two runs before departing for a pinch-hitter in the sixth. Lee Smith pitched out of two jams to

post his seventh save. L.A.'s Tom Brennan, 1-2, took the loss.

Padres 12, Cardinals 2

ST. LOUIS — Terry Kennedy hit a pair of two-run singles and Carmelo Martinez doubled and homered to drive in three runs, powering the San Diego Padres past the mistake-plagued St. Louis Cardinals 12-2 Tuesday.

Four St. Louis errors, one by each starting infielder, led to seven earned San Diego runs. They gave the Cards, the National League's top-fielding team in 1984, 11 errors in the past four games.

Giants 5, Pirates 3

PITTSBURGH — Dan Gladden's triple triggered a three-run third inning and Gary Rajsich hit a pair of run-scoring singles that helped the San Francisco Giants defeat the Pittsburgh Pirates 5-3 Tuesday.

Jim Gott, 2-0 since being acquired by the Giants from Toronto in an off-season trade, allowed five hits, struck out three and walked one in seven innings. Mark Davis pitched the eighth and Scott Garrelts the ninth for his third save.

Tigers 10, Rangers 1

ARLINGTON — Larry Herndon and Nelson Simmons homered on

consecutive pitches in the fourth inning, and Lance Parrish and Lou Whitaker also belted home runs Tuesday night to lead the Detroit Tigers past the Texas Rangers 10-1.

Kirk Gibson collected four hits, drove in three runs and scored three times as the Tigers banged out 15 hits off five Texas pitchers.

Jack Morris, 4-3, pitched seven innings for the victory. He gave up five hits, including Buddy Bell's second homer of the season in the sixth.

Loser Dickie Noles, 2-2, lasted only 3 2/3 innings. He gave up six hits, including the home runs by Herndon, his third, and Simmons, his second.

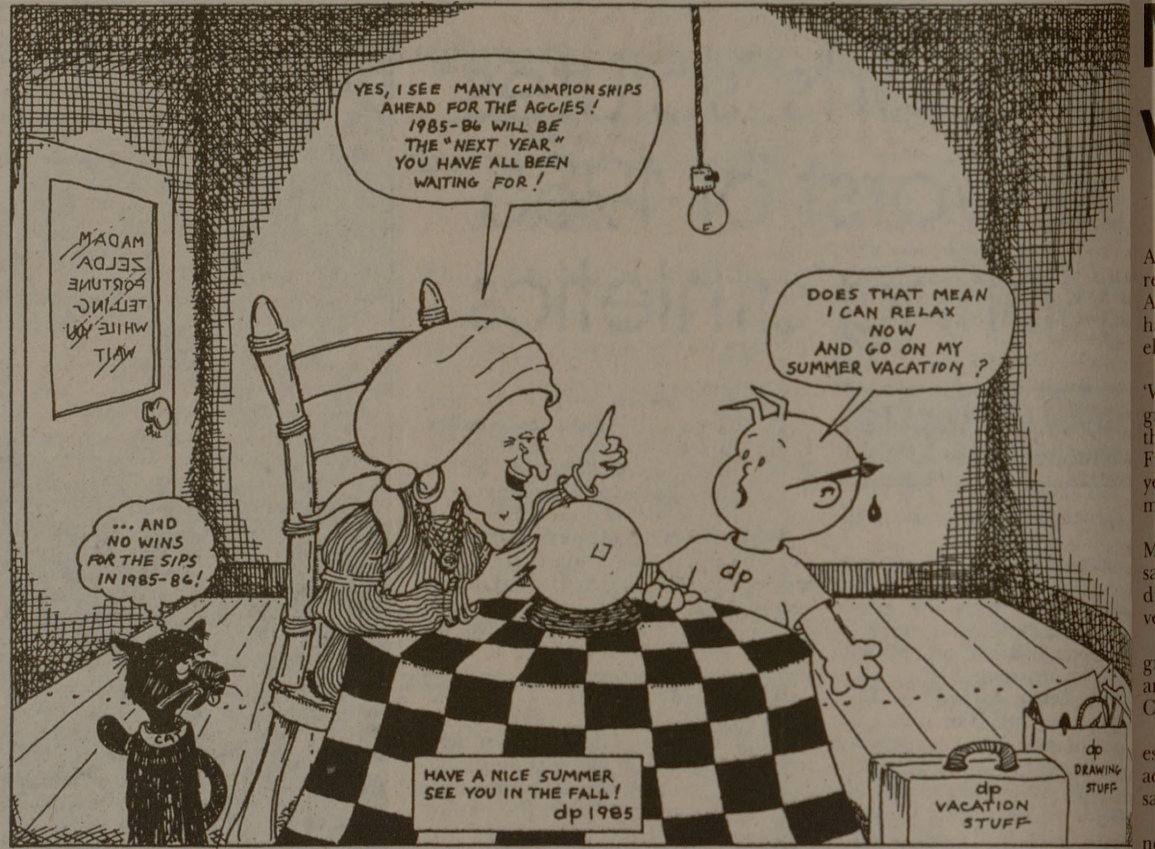
Red Sox 6, Angels 4

BOSTON — Tony Armas belted his seventh homer of the season and singled to drive home three runs Tuesday night as the Boston Red Sox rolled to 6-4 victory over the California Angels.

Roger Clemens, 3-3, allowed six hits and struck out seven before departing in favor of Bob Stanley with none out in the California eighth. Stanley gave up RBI singles to pinch-hitters Jerry Narron and Rob Wilfong in the eighth before going on to get his fifth save.

Blue Jays 10, A's 1

TORONTO — Ernie Whitt belted a two-run homer and George Bell singled home two runs during a six-run sixth inning Tuesday night to power the Toronto Blue Jays past



the Oakland A's 10-1.

Rance Mulliniks and Lloyd Moseby stroked consecutive doubles in the first inning to give Toronto a 1-0 lead, and Whitt smacked his second home run of the season in the fourth off loser Don Sutton, 2-3. Winner Dave Stieb, 2-3, allowed seven hits over six innings.

Twins 8, Yankees 6

MINNEAPOLIS — Roy Smalley hit a two-run double to cap a wild first inning and Tim Teufel

smashed a two-run home run Tuesday night, leading the Minnesota Twins to an 8-6 victory over the New York Yankees.

The Twins, who have won 12 of their last 14 games, snapped the Yankees' four-game winning streak under Manager Billy Martin, in the seventh game of his fourth term with the team.

Orioles 4, Royals 2

KANSAS CITY — Larry Sheets pounded a two-run homer and Mike

Young hit a solo shot to support Dixon's four-hit pitching over six innings Tuesday night and the Baltimore Orioles rolled past Kansas City 4-2. It was the Royals fifth straight loss.

Brewers 5, Mariners 2

MILWAUKEE — Ben Oglund homered and drove in three runs and Moose Haas pitched a five-inning Tuesday night to lead the Milwaukee Brewers to a 5-2 victory over the Seattle Mariners.

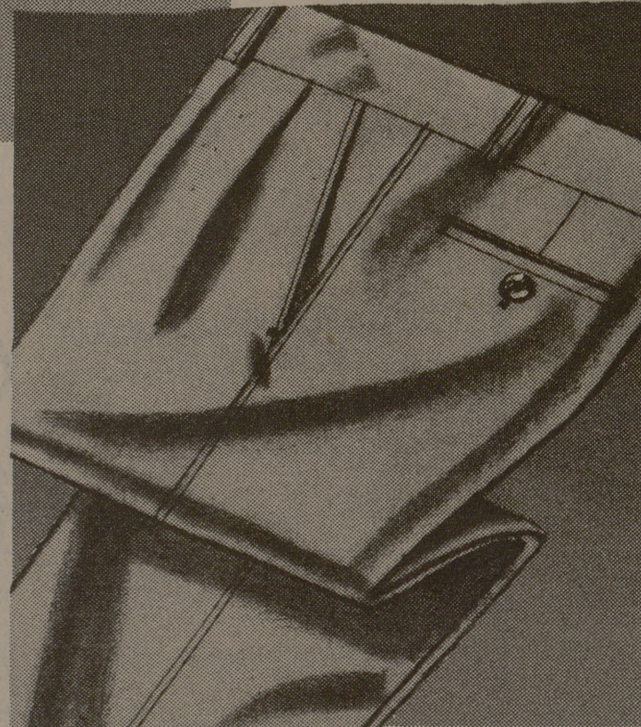
