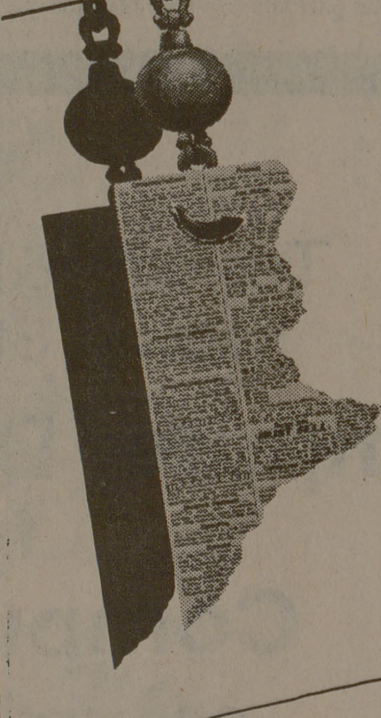

but contended the dollar value those exports would increase.

Harkin also said the bill would solve one of the biggest corn headaches of farm policymakers: high cost of federal subsidies.

He claimed the measure would cost only \$11 billion for price supports over the next three years, less than the \$29 billion figure in a proposed Senate budget agreement.

A major reason for the bill would be a shift of the costs of subsidies to higher consumer prices, he said.

The bill would boost costs an estimated 4 percent in first year — about \$13 billion — an additional one-half percent annually for the next decade.

Central features of the bill include a nationwide referendum every year for the primary commodity: wheat, corn, soybeans and cotton. A majority of growers approved producers would be required to 15 percent of their cropland.

In return, they would receive sharply higher price supports for the crops they grow on the remaining acreage.

For example, the amount the government will lend a farmer for a bushel of corn would rise from \$1.30 to \$3.60 in 1986.

Other provisions would establish 30 million acre program to re-erode highly erodible land from production for at least 10 years, and penalize farmers who plow out new cropland by denying them farm-program benefits.

The bill also would nearly double international food aid under the Food for Peace program to \$1.5 billion.

Sponsors said while there is a chance the measure will be approved by Congress, it could play an important role in changing the debate on what to do about farm-term agriculture policy.

"Everybody's talking about market share, and about how we're going to lower prices," Harkin aide George Palmer said. "That's what we've got to get the debate back to."

which the LCRA could continue to get a certain amount of the from the upper Colorado, would gradually decrease as West Texas consumers increased.

Montford said his bill clarified definition of unappropriated water by providing that "water rights being beneficially used shall be subject of new appropriations."

Montford said the provision made mandatory instead of optional at the request of the Brazos Authority.

"This bill would make more available for cities downstream Corpus Christi," said Sen. Simms, D-San Angelo.

Truan tried to amend Montford's bill by saying it would not become effective until and unless voters prove a statewide water plan is to be on the ballot in November. The amendment failed 27-4.

In other action Tuesday, the state approved on voice vote and to the House a bill that would require hospital and medical insurance policies to include prepaid benefits for alcohol and drug dependence along with coverage for other specified diseases or injuries.

The Senate approved on voice vote a House amendment and to the governor a bill that would low operators of bingo games have their criminal records checked.

obvious to Meadows, however, treated as unthinkable by some. That reaction, she says, was caused by people not listening to the natives listed in the book.

"People never heard what I said," Meadows said. "They heard symbols, the things with which I was wrapped. People do not hear choices, they hear predictions. There is not very much sophistication in the public about statements of the future."

Meadows said in her book that growth in population and resources were to continue unchanged, but the limits of the planet would be reached within 100 years. But she also said that the future can be altered if people begin taking an interest and working toward solving world resource problems.

"It is a tremendous sign of disempowerment as a public, that don't think the future is something we can choose," Meadows says. "We're giving the message 'Tell me what's going to hit me' that I can prepare myself for rather than 'Tell me the opportunities that I can grab in order to change history.'"
