





'Bruised' Astro coach bitter about his firing

HOUSTON — Former Houston Astros assistant coach Don Leppert contended last week that he had been fired in a shakeup of the Astros' coaching staff while General Manager Al Rosen said Leppert was only being reassigned.

Leppert repeated his dissatisfaction with the move Monday and said that perhaps he didn't fit in with an organization that seemed more interested in looking "clean-shaven" than winning baseball games.

Now Leppert is officially out of a

job.
"I talked to Don this morning and told him I don't think we can use him anymore if he can't go along with what we feel are the best interests of this ball club," Rosen said after reading Leppert's comments in The Houston Post.

Leppert, 52, an Astros coach for the past six years, became the odd man out last week when Rosen decided to bring Les Moss back from a minor league assignment to work with pitching coach Jerry Walker.

Rosen said he created a position for Leppert evaluating minor league players, managers and coaches and reporting back to Rosen.

"I thought I was being very creative with Don and it would have been something that really would have helped me to have someone of Don's ability telling me what's going on in the minor leagues," Rosen said

Leppert, who had nothing to do with pitching instruction, told The Post "Two other guys (coaches) didn't do their jobs last week in Chi-

cago and I get fired. It's not right and I'm a little bruised over that."

Rosen denied last week's performances in Chicago had anything to do with his decison.

"It had nothing to do with what happened in Chicago last week," Rosen said. "It was just in evaluating the coaching staff we had and the roles they played, that this was best for the organization.'

Moss and Walker worked to-gether with Astros pitchers last sea-son but Moss started this season working with minor league pitchers.

"This move was like going back to the drawing board," Rosen said. "Last season it worked better. I was not satisified with the way our bull-pen was working when you have

The Astros lost two games Cubs last week in Chicago rookie Mark Ross in the game ace reliever Dave Smith warm in the bullpen.

"We lost two games in a row cause we left a rookie in there, Ross, with one of the best n handed relief pitchers this Dave Smith, standing there wan up," Leppert said.

"I still don't know what happe whether it was a miscommunical or what," Leppert said. "Butitus my fault. I had nothing to do

Leppert, whose contract in through the end of this season, said he apparently didn't fit in withe image the Astros management tries to enforce.
