Two Americans killed

Air base site of car bomb

FRANKFURT, West Germany — A car filled with explosives blew up at a U.S. air base outside Frankfurt on Thursday, killing two Americans — an airman and a woman civilian. Authorities said more than 20 Americans were injured.
The Federal Criminal Office said it was seeking a dozen members of the leftist Red Army Faction terrorist group in connection with the bombing at the Rhein-Main base.
In Washington, White House spokesman Larry Speakes said, "Preliminary information available to us here indicates a violent, radical group has targeted our military and other Western service personnel, as well as innocent civilians, for acts of violence."
Kurt Rebmann, West Germany's chief federal prosecutor, said the explosives were planted in a car with forged American Forces license plates. The bomb went off at 7:15 a.m. (1:15 a.m. EDT) in a parking lot as base personnel were reporting for work.
The blast blew out scores of windows in the headquarters building of the 435th Tactical Airlift Wing and a

nearby dormitory, damaged or destroyed dozens of automobiles and ripped a hole one yard deep and two yards wide in the ground.
The U.S. military's European Command headquarters in Stuttgart identified one of the dead as Airman 1st Class Frank H. Scarton, 19, of Woodhaven, Mich. The military said in a telex that Scarton, a member of the 437th Military Airlift Wing, was on temporary duty at Rhein-Main.
The military said the second victim was a civilian woman, but declined to further identify her pending notification of her family. West German police said she was an American.

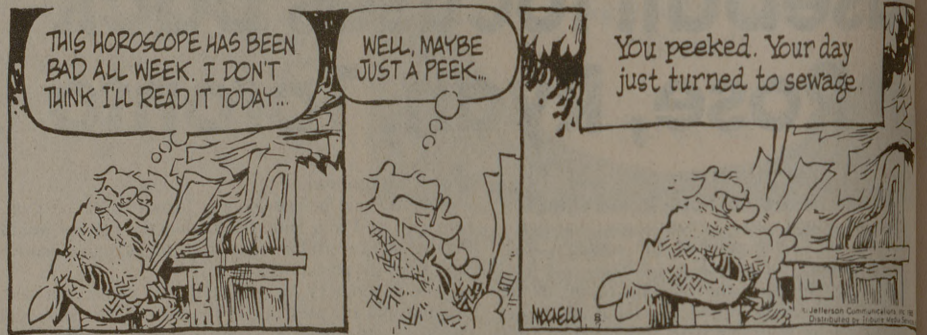
The statement from the military said that "more than 20 people" were treated in connection with the blast. It said at least two of the injured remained hospitalized, but gave no conditions for them.
Security was immediately tightened at the sprawling facility of 4,000 Air Force personnel six miles outside Frankfurt.
"The circumstances of the attack point to the Red Army Faction," Rebmann said of the car bomb. The terrorist gang has been responsible

for numerous attacks against North Atlantic Treaty Organization and U.S. military facilities in West Germany.
Late Thursday, the West German Federal Criminal Office released a statement naming 12 Red Army Faction members being sought in the bombing.
West Germany's chief government spokesman, Friedhelm Ost, said that West Germany would use all legal methods available to "find and punish the murderers."
Entrance to Rhein-Main, one of the major U.S. Air Force bases in Europe, is strictly controlled with identification card checks.

About 40 West German federal police aided U.S. military investigators in a probe near the bomb site.
The bombing followed predictions by West German authorities in a recent report that the Red Army Faction was planning a new wave of attacks against military and civilian targets in West Germany.
An estimated 254,000 American troops are stationed in West Germany.

Pope tries to reconcile culture with religious teaching in Africa

LOME, Togo — Pope John Paul II embarked on his third trip to Africa Thursday, encouraging the continent's Christians to hold on to the "wisdom" of their native culture while embracing church teaching.
The first stop on his seven-nation tour was Lome, the capital of Togo, where ocean breezes fluttered the pope's white robes and the flowing,

multicolored tunics of the thousands of faithful who greeted him warmly.
The state television commentator said "the entire Togolese nation wishes the pope a hearty welcome including our ancestors buried deep underground."
Among the diplomats who greeted the pope after he arrived at Lome Airport was North Korean Ambassador Kim Yang-Fang. Vatican officials said it was the first such

gesture ever by a North Korean voy.

The Vatican has no diplomatic relations with the Communist country which has banned Western religion.
The pope has said major objectives of the 12-day trip — his longest journey to Africa — to consolidate the church's conversion and improve relations with Moslems.

Reagan signs bill giving U.S. aid to Nicaraguan rebels

WASHINGTON — President Reagan signed a \$25.4 billion foreign aid bill Thursday, saying he was "particularly pleased" it provides for the resumption of U.S. aid to the rebels in Nicaragua.
But Reagan also criticized the measure — the first such legislation passed by Congress in four years — as offering "substantial reductions" in military assistance, a development he termed "disappointing."
The bill authorizes \$12.7 billion in

foreign aid for each of the next two years. It authorizes foreign aid spending in scores of developing nations around the world but awards the largest amounts to Israel and Egypt.
Not since 1981 were both houses

of Congress able to agree on foreign aid spending authority. Attempts at passage always broke up over policy disputes, forcing the Reagan administration to use stop-gap financing measures for foreign aid.
The bill Reagan signed into law

includes spending authority of \$3 billion for Israel for each of the two years, plus a one-time infusion of \$1.5 billion in emergency economic aid. Egypt will get \$2.1 billion for each year plus \$500 million in emergency economic aid.
As approved by Congress last month, the measure froze foreign aid spending at the levels approved for fiscal 1985, which ends Sept. 30. The administration had asked for \$13.2 billion for each of the two years.

No survivors found of JAL

KITA-AKAMURA, Japan — A Japanese jumbo jet packed with 524 people crashed in rugged mountains of central Japan on Tuesday. First reports from the site there were no survivors, making the worst single-plane crash in history.
Three dozen helicopter-borne troops made a rope descent Tuesday morning to the wreckage of the Japan Air Lines Boeing 747.
The jetliner crashed on a steep, thickly forested mountain slope. The pilot had reported a door broken, that he was fighting for control and would try an emergency landing.
Hiroshi Ochiai, a Self Defense Force spokesman, said initial reports from the crash site, at about 5,500 feet, indicated no survivors and the 509 passengers and 15 crew members aboard.

JAL spokesman Geoffrey said two Americans were on the jetliner. They were identified as Edward Anderson, believed to be 48, and Michael Hanson, both employees of Stearns Catalyst Co., of Denver, Colo. Neil McLain, a Stearns vice president, confirmed the identities of Anderson and Hanson were on the plane.
The jetliner crashed at about 10 p.m. (5:54 a.m. EDT), on the northeast side of Mount Ogura, a 6,929-foot peak about 50 miles from Yokohama and 70 miles northwest of Tokyo.
Pilots of two other planes in the area were said to have reported seeing a plane in flight and on fire before the crash. A Japan Air Self-Defense Force helicopter reported
