JOHANNESBURG, South Africa Black students on Wednesday mobbed a teacher they accused of being a police informer, threatening to set him afire. He escaped but riot police rolled into the Soweto schoolard in 15 armored vehicles.

The teacher, who was not identified, reached his car and drove away on slashed tires, witnesses reported. Most of the 1,000 students fled be-fore the police arrived at Thaba Ja-bula High School in Soweto, Johannesburg's huge black township of

more than 1.5 million. "We want to burn him alive," one student said. He claimed the teacher

had reported class boycotts to police. More than 100,000 black students have boycotted classes for months in townships near Johannesburg and in the eastern Cape Province, the areas most affected by a year of rioting against white rule in which more than 600 blacks have been killed than 600 blacks have been killed.

Desmond Tutu, the black Angli-can bishop of Johannesburg and winner of the 1984 Nobel Peace Prize, told a rally of more than 1,000

Viljoen's comment appeared to rule out a direct political role for blacks. "white" South Africa. Tutu's remarks reflected wide-spread sentiment that blacks should not be divided between "urban" and homeland" groups, with differing rights.
