Anders to serve 3 years for firearm possession

HOUSTON — Benny Anders, a forward on the University of Houston basketball team last season, received three years' probation after pleading no contest to a charge of possessing a firearm on school prop-

State District Judge I.D. McMaster issued the sentence Wednesday and placed Anders on deferred adjudication, which means he will have no criminal record if he meets the terms of his probation.

Prosecutor Cheryl Turner said the charge stems from a May 20 inci-dent in which Anders allegedly pointed a gun at student Cedric D. Jones at a campus gym.

"They got into an arguement because the guy wanted to play basketball with Benny," Turner said. "Benny didn't want to play. The argument got a little bit heated and in "

guy threw a starting block at him."

Turner said Anders then went to his car and got a gun. He allegedly returned to the gym and aimed a

A campus police officer arrived at the scene and Anders fled, the pros-ecutor said. Anders later led officers to the gun, which had been tossed in a gym shower, she said. The gun was cocked and fully loaded, Turner

A student court suspended Anders for the summer and fall semesters because of the incident, university officials said.

Anders said that after he returns to school, he will continue to study sociology and graduate, even if he is not permitted to play basketball

"Finishing school, that's my main priority," Anders said.

8th holes. He didn't card a single bogey during the round.


