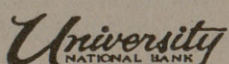

Evacuation testing rarely real situation

 WASHINGTON — Amid criticism that government-required evacuation tests for jetliners often bear little resemblance to the problems faced in a crash, the Federal Aviation Administration is considering an overhaul of its rules.
 Before a jetliner may carry passengers, the government must be convinced a full plane can be evacuated in 90 seconds. But flight attendants, members of Congress and safety experts say the tests are often contrived to meet the regulations and give little assurance of what can be expected in an accident.
 Rep. James L. Oberstar, D-Minn., whose House investigations subcommittee oversees FAA activity, says changes in the agency's approach to aircraft evacuation are overdue.
 "We've got . . . no uniformity, just sort of a haphazard approach to (evacuation) rule making and safety, and lives of people are at stake," Oberstar complained.
 Rep. Newt Gingrich of Georgia calls the approach taken by the FAA and industry on evacuation "totally out of touch with the real world."
 Concern over the ability of airline passengers to escape an aircraft cabin took on added weight recently with the Aug. 22 fire aboard a British charter Boeing 737 as it was taking off from Manchester, England. Fifty-four people were killed from toxic smoke and flames.

Willie Nelson consults farmers on concert proceeds

 CHAMPAIGN, Illinois — Singer Willie Nelson has invited about 150 farmers and farm leaders from around the country to Illinois for talks on how to spend proceeds from the FarmAid concert, officials said Tuesday.
 Nelson, Gov. James Thompson and state Agriculture Director Larry Verries were to attend Wednesday night's meeting at the University of Illinois Assembly Hall in Champaign, said state Agriculture Department spokeswoman Mia Jazo.
 "This is simply an organizational meeting," said Thompson spokesman Woody Mosgers, adding that no decisions on spending were expected during Wednesday's meeting.
 Nelson, in an interview before a Monday night performance in suburban Chicago, said the best way to use the money would be to offer farmers low-interest loans.
 More than three dozen entertainers are to perform at the 12-hour concert scheduled for Sept. 22 at the University of Illinois football stadium.
 The list includes Bob Dylan, Neil Young, the Beach Boys, Kenny Rogers, Alabama, Tom Petty, Wayne Jennings, Eddie Van Halen and Loretta Lynn.
 Nelson said he got the idea for the concert when Dylan made a pitch for American farmers while performing at Live Aid, which raised money to help feed African famine victims.
 The country singer-songwriter also challenged the Reagan administration to match whatever is raised from the concert on a dollar-per-dollar basis.
