'Test' time Saturday for Miami

Gators, Hurricanes set to settle Florida rivalry

The end of the season usually is the time for in-state rivalries. Florida and Miami, however, get together at the start.

The Orange Bowl will have a rare sellout when fifth-ranked Florida visits Miami Saturday night. The game matches two coaches who are former colleagues.

Florida's Galen Hall and Miami's Jimmy Johnson were on the Oklahoma staff together from 1970-72. They arrived in the State of Florida last year by different routes. While Johnson's travels took him from Oklahoma to Arkansas to Pitt to Oklahoma State (as head coach from 1979-83), Hall remained at Oklahoma until last season, when he became Florida's offensive coordinator.

Hall has yet to lose as a head coach. He replaced Charley Pell three games into the 1984 season and posted an 8-0 record the rest of the way.

The Gators are 3 1/2-point favorites but the pick is 24-21, Miami.

games of the second set and the third game of the third.

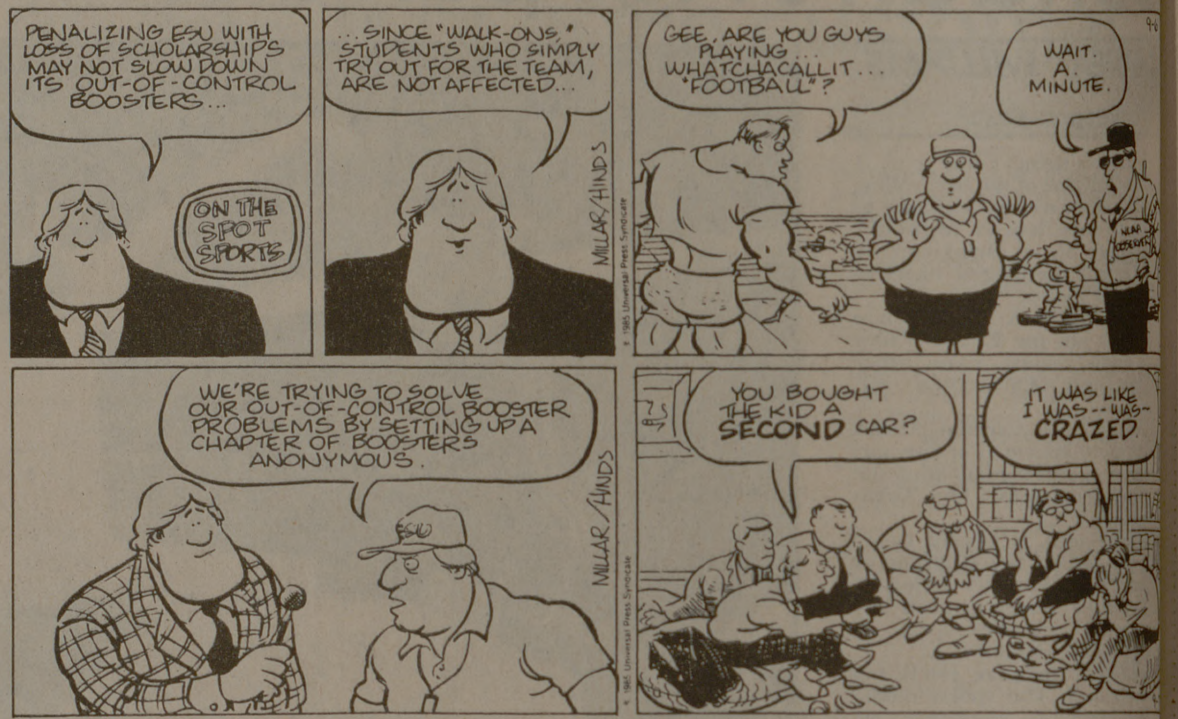
"I played pretty well; he really wasn't," Connors said. "I wanted to jump on top of him early."

Runners ready to race up the SWC standings

When you think of cross-country, the movie *Cannonball Run*, about a car race from New York to Los Angeles, comes to mind.

After a fifth-place Southwest Conference finish last season, the Texas A&M cross-country team is ready to race its way across the standings.

A&M's cross-country season, which opens with the A&M Invitational on Sept. 12 and continues until late November, is the first of the three track seasons in which the Aggies compete. A&M's indoor and

outdoor track and field seasons start in the spring.

Cross-country meets consist of a three-mile course for the women and a five-mile course for the men. Most meets are usually run on a golf course, as the A&M Invitational will be, or on a grassy surface. Each team enters seven runners, of which five can place.

A&M Coach Ted Nelson admits the Aggies' chances of moving up in the conference standings look slim.

Arturo Barrios, one of the nation's premier cross-country runners, used up his eligibility last year

after a second-place finish at the SWC meet in Austin.

In addition to losing Barrios, years' No. 3 runner, Huey Tye will be red-shirted.

Despite a lack of experience, Nelson predicts a strong performance from his seven-man squad in the SWC, which had six teams in the nation's Top 25.

"We think we're going to be a better team this year," Nelson said. "It really had a good recruiting year, just all depends on how those young

in contention, even though he easily won the opening game of each set.

He took Lendl to duce in the second game of the match as the crowd in Louis Armstrong Stadium at the National Tennis Center settled in for an epic struggle. They never got it, however, as Lendl smothered his opponent as much as the humidity.

The Czech broke Noah in the third game when the Frenchman double-faulted at break point. He broke his service again in the fifth game, this time at 15.

And in the second set, it was Lendl once again breaking away from a 1-1 deadlock, breaking Noah's serve in the third and seventh games en route to a two-set advantage.

At one point, late in the match, Noah flung his racket in exasperation at another backhand cross-court passing shot that dipped drastically to nip the sideline, knowing he couldn't reach it. When he held serve at love in the fifth game of the third set, the Frenchman tri-

umphantly raised his arms into the air, sensing it was a hollow victory but a victory just the same.

And in the next game, he broke Noah at 30, moving to break point with a backhand volley down the line and wrapping up the service when Noah's backhand sailed into the net.

Noah fought off three break points in the next game, the match hold service. But four points later, Lendl sealed his trip to the semifinals when he rocketed a forehand that landed right in the corner of the sideline and baseline.
