

First meeting of Student Senate set for tonight

The items to be addressed today at the first meeting of the 1985-86 Student Senate include a speech by Student Body President Sean Royall, appointments of students to several University committees and reports from the five vice presidents of the Senate committees.

Speaker of the Senate, Laurie Johnson, said she expects Royall to discuss goals for Student Govern-ment and inform Senate members of work done over the summer.

Because of vacancies in several University committees, including the traffic committee and the dining hall menu board, the positions will be filled at this meeting, she said.

The election committee will propose dates, polling places and filing fees for freshmen elections. The Senate will vote on the issues, John-

Teacher wounded while teaching drill team

HOUSTON - A high school teacher who was shot while instructing a drill team said Tuesday he plans to return to his teaching duties despite the constant fears about the "violent area" where the school is located.

Harold Haynes, 34, an English teacher at Wheatley High School, said such attacks are "an occupation

Haynes, who serves as the drill team's sponsor, was shot about 4

15 minutes after school ended. Haynes was listed in good condition at Ben Taub Hospital, a hospital spokesman said Tues-

Homicide Sgt. Ken Johnson said the three boys — whom he described as juveniles — do not attend the school but apparently had some pre-vious contact with Haynes.

But Haynes, who has been teaching at Wheatley for eight years, said he had never seen the boys before.

No arrests have been made in the case, police spokesman Al Baker said Johnson said the youths entered

the cafeteria where the girls were practicing and verbally abused the teacher. Haynes asked them to leave,

but they began to taunt him.

"As he ushered them out, they grabbed a broom," Johnson said.
"He had one end and two (youths) had the other end.'

As Haynes and the two youths




