

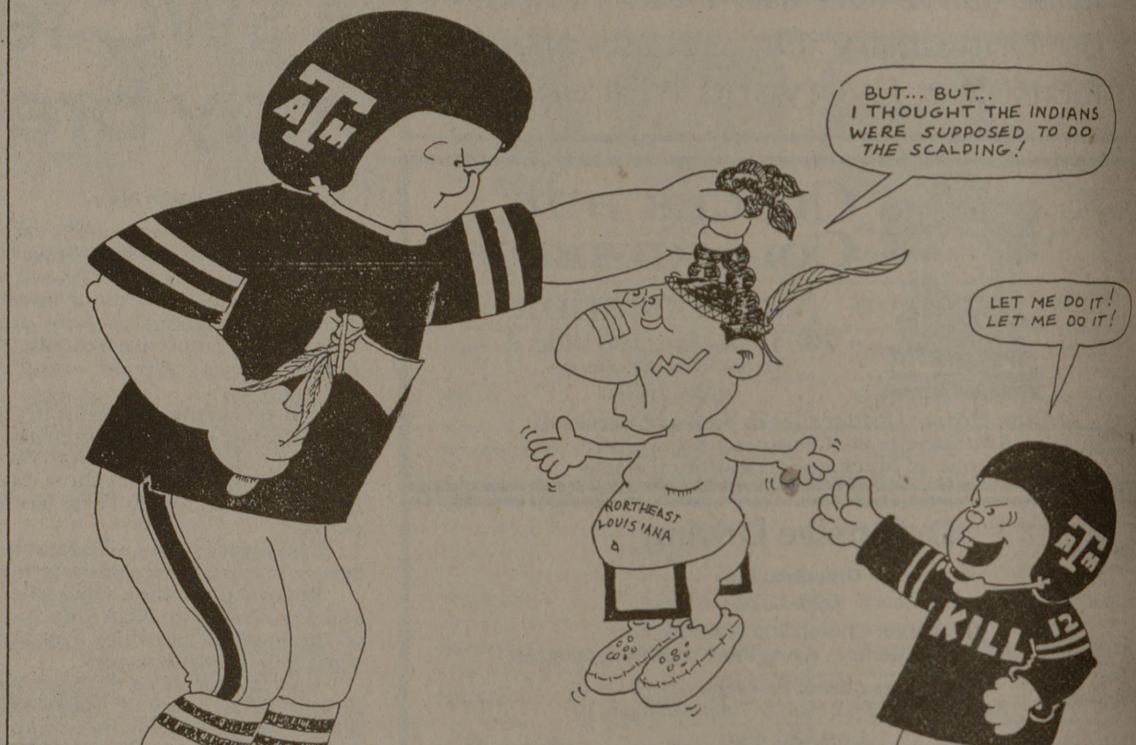

## 'Old Maroons' keep rugby close to heart

Old A&M never die, they just become former students. Well, the same is true with the Texas A&M rugby team.

Its former members belong to the "Old Maroons."

The initial Old Maroons came from the 1973 A&M team. Mark Anthony, a member of the team which won the 1974 NCAA Championship, said the Old Maroons attempted to play a schedule at first, but it didn't work out.

"We gave up the idea of playing a schedule when only six players showed up instead of 15," Anthony said.

After four dormant years, the club reorganized with a different purpose.

"We support A&M rugby when we can," Anthony said. "The Old Maroons do things like help pay for

transportation. We've also purchased team jerseys for tournament play."

The Old Maroons make their presence known at the A&M rugby games, too.

"Whenever we play there are usually one or two Old Maroons on the sidelines," said Mark Flinn, public relations director for the Aggie rugby team. "They support us at the games — put us up, take us out to dinner — little things that mean a lot when you're playing."

"We try and pay them back for their support over the years by inviting them down to play."

Invite them they did.

This weekend the A&M club will scrum against its former teammates.

"The game means a lot to us because the Old Maroons keep supporting the team," Flinn said. "We have a lot of pride in our club. We've won for 17 straight years collegia-

telly, and we want to win for 17 more."

The Old Maroon Game originated in 1978. So far the Old Maroons have the edge on the younger guys, having won all but one game.

"They (the A&M squad) blew a good thing after they won," Anthony said. "The beat us in the Spring of '84 and haven't scheduled us since then."

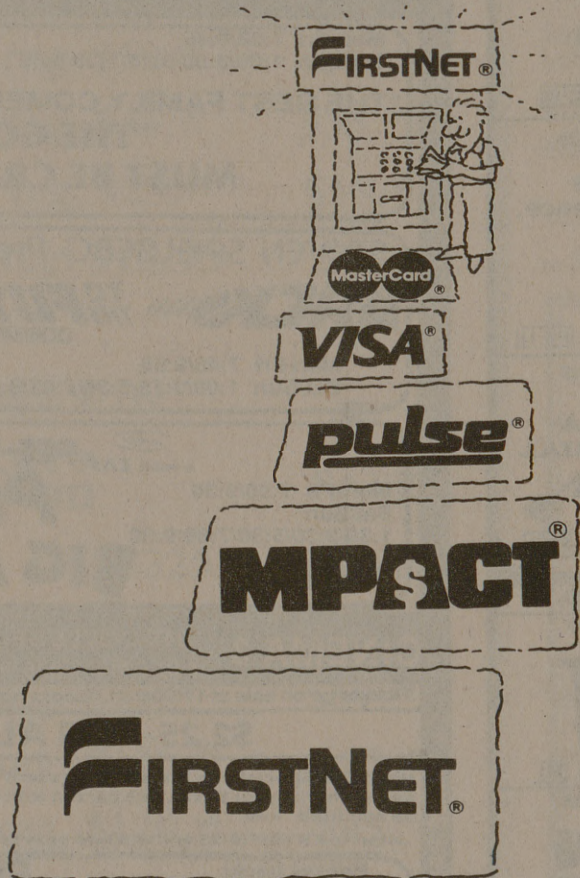
Inviting the Old Maroons down to play ties in with the fraternity-like atmosphere which surrounds the rugby team.

"When we travel the other team takes care of us."

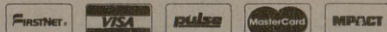
The Old Maroon game will start at 1 p.m. Saturday. The match will be held on the rugby field behind the Zachry Engineering Building parking lot.

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
