A&M pageant preparation underway

The day after Teresa Fritz was chosen as 1985 Miss Texas A&M University, MSC Hospitality began preparations for the 1986 Miss Texas A&M University Scholarship Pageant. Applications can be picked up now in the Student Programs Office.

The pageant is organized, produced and executed by about 22 MSC Hospitality staff members and 12 subcommittees, Bonne Bejarano, executive director of the pageant, says. The project has grown into one of the largest professional projects funded by the MSC.

"The whole reason the MSC sponsors the pageant is for student development," Bejarano says. "Not only for the contestants but for the pageant staff, MSC Hospitality and the entire MSC."

The pageant is a franchise of the Miss Texas/Miss America Program. Over \$5,500 in scholarships and gifts are awarded to the winner and the runners-up. The winner of the pageant will represent A&M in the Miss Texas Pageant.

Funds for the pageant are raised by selling \$250 sponsorships to 20 area merchants every year. The sponsors get free advertising before the pageant through promotional events such as the Mr. Aggie Contest, fashion shows in the MSC and appearances at the Post Oak Mall.

On Oct. 27 and 28, 20 finalists and five alternates will be chosen after a screening process consisting of a seven minute interview and a three minute talent performance. The panel of five judges, chosen from the community and the campus, will look for someone with not only talent and beauty but for someone who is organized, a hard worker, can express themself well in public, and is aware of what is going on in the world and the community.

After the 20 contestants are chosen, they are offered various seminars which the pageant staff hopes will help the girls gain confidence in areas such as walking and talent. The grooming seminar, which is learning how to apply stage and personal makeup, and the walking seminar are mandatory. The talent workshop, which is taught by local people, helps the contestants emphasize their good points. The fashion workshop teaches the girls to dress in their own style.

"We have reputable judges which makes the caliber of the pageant very high," Bejarano said.

Gubernatorial Series to feature Rep. Loeffler

U.S. Rep. Tom Loeffler, a candidate for the Republican gubernatorial nomination in the spring, will speak on issues relating to the election tonight at 8 in 308 Rudder.

The address, sponsored by MSC Political Forum, is part of the committee's Gubernatorial Series. The purpose of the series is to allow candidates to present their views on issues relating to the election and on politics in general.

The series attempts to increase student awareness about the governor's race, said Heidi Kemp, state programs coordinator for Political Forum.

The series will present the other gubernatorial candidates throughout the school year, Kemp said. Former Rep. Kent Hance will speak in October, while former Gov. William Clements and Gov. Mark White are set to appear in the spring.

Loeffler is currently serving his fourth term in the U.S. House of Representatives. Elected in 1978, he is the first Republican to represent the 21st District in Washington.

After graduating from the University of Texas School of Law, Loeffler served as chief legal counsel to former Sen. John Tower. After two years as a Senate aide, a short run as deputy for congressional affairs in the Federal Energy Administration, he was appointed special assistant for legislative affairs to former President Gerald Ford in 1975.

Loeffler currently serves as deputy whip of the Republican Party.
