## SWC puts 4 teams in AP's Top 20 poll

DALLAS-Nearly five years have passed since the last time four South-
west Conference teams made joint appearances in the Top 20 in the Associated Press college football poll.
This week, SMU $(2-0)$ is No
This week, SMU (2-0) is No. 3, while Arkansas (3-0) is in the No. 10 spot.
Baylor ( $3-1$ ) is No. 19 and Texas (2-0) is 20 th. On Oct. 6, 1980 , the same four SWC teams earned berths in the AP poll.
Texas was No. 3, Arkansas No. 15, Baylor No. 18 and SMU, just starting its football revival, was No. 20 .
Texas Coach Fred Akers said the latest poll indicates that the SWC is beginning to get the respect he thinks it deserves.
"Ive said all along that this is the toughest conference in the country and I think that the rankings are beginning to reflect that," Akers said.
