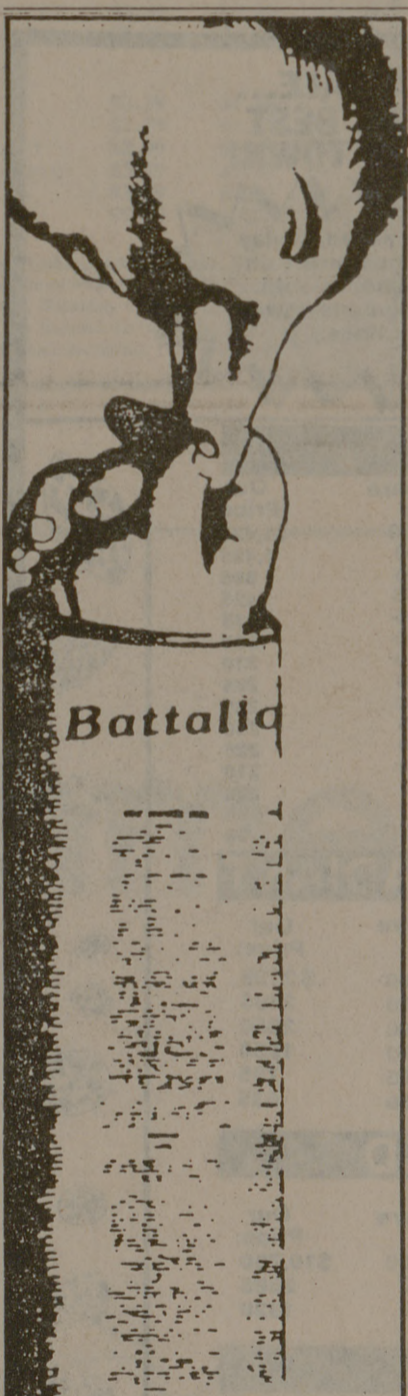

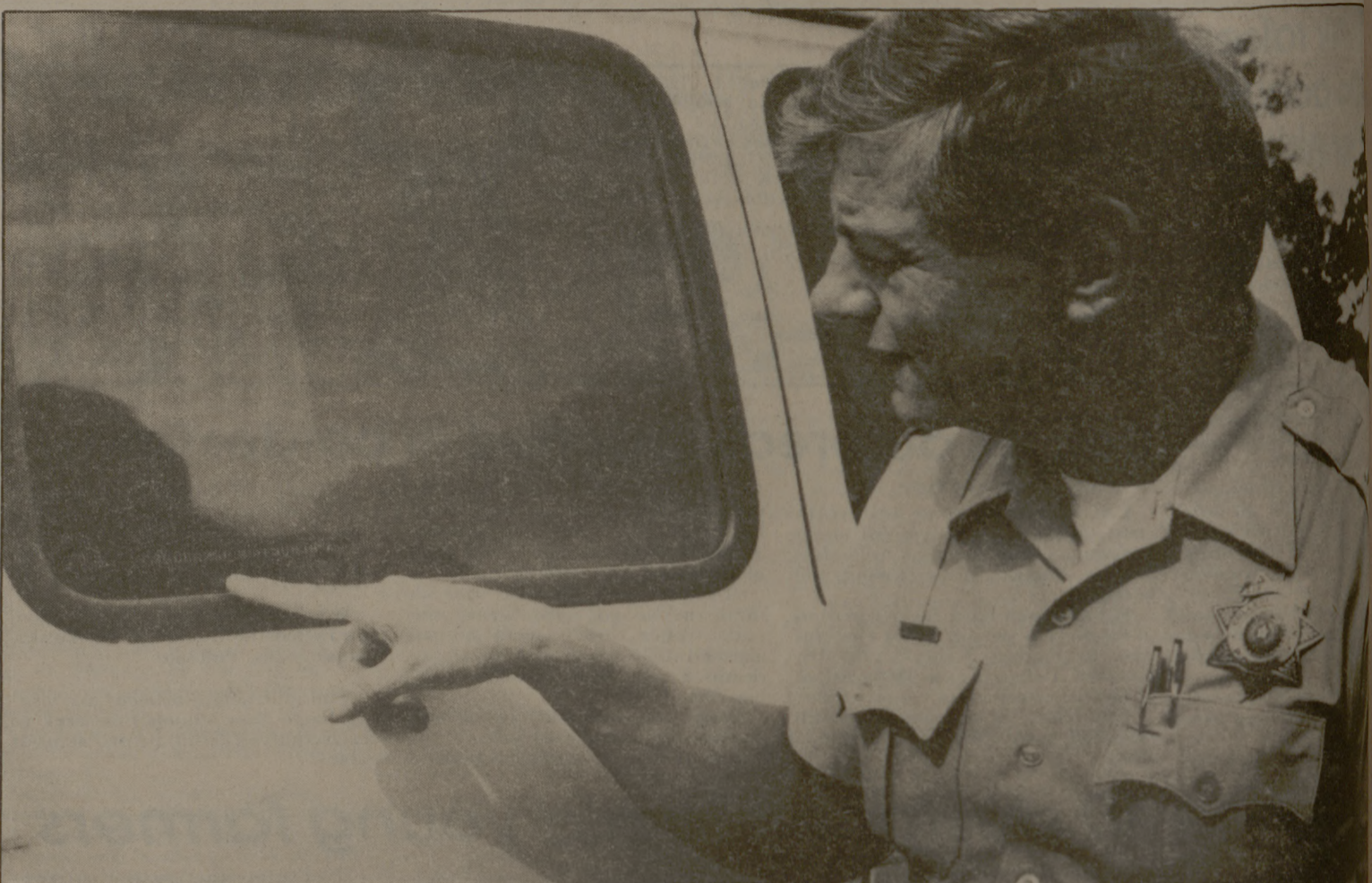

## Police sponsoring vehicle ID program

In an effort to combat the rising number of vehicle thefts in the area, the College Station Police Department is sponsoring a vehicle identification program, a department representative said Tuesday.

"If the property is identified, people (thieves) are going to tend to shy away from it," said Lt. Bernie Kapella.

Kapella said vehicle owners can pay \$65 to have the hubcaps, win-

dows, T-tops and bumpers marked with an identification number.

"We stress that people should have their motor identification number marked on those parts," Kapella said. "If you want anything else done, they charge you extra."

He said the numbers, which are sandblasted onto the surface, will not mar the appearance of the vehicle. The series of numbers is about one-fourth inch high and five inches long.

The vehicle identification will be done through the College Station Police Department by a member of the Crime Prevention Center in Houston, Kapella said. He said the program will begin when and if at least 10 people are interested. So far, one person is interested. Ten people participated in 1984, the first year a program of this type was offered in College Station.

Kapella said the program could help prevent the increase of vehicle thefts in the College Station area.

The number of vehicle thefts increased from 93 in 1983 to 1984. So far in 1985, 77 have been stolen.

Kapella said similar programs have existed in large cities in Houston and Chicago for years.

"From information I have, other cities have not been successful," Kapella said.

## Gilley's owner pleads innocent to charges of attempted murder

HOUSTON — The owner of Gilley's Club, a country-western night spot made famous by the movie "Urban Cowboy," pleaded innocent Tuesday to charges of attempted murder and aggravated assault.

Club owner Sherwood Cryer, 63, entered his plea before State District Judge Albert Pruett. He is free on \$5,000 bond.

A Harris County grand jury indicted Cryer on Sept. 30, alleging he fired a shotgun at karate instructor Randall Everett Johnston.

Johnston, 27, and another martial arts teacher, Joseph Fitzgerald Ac-

ton, 34, were walking Nov. 26 outside the Pasadena martial arts studio where they worked when the shooting occurred. Neither man was injured.

Cryer is indicted only in the shooting of Johnston, who now is serving a 22-year prison sentence for burglary.

The indictments were returned despite the advice of Harris County prosecutors, who maintained they lacked sufficient evidence to pursue the case in court.

Assistant District Attorney Chuck Rosenthal said that Acton told grand jurors he believed Cryer was one of

two masked men who fired at him.

Police using trained dogs tracked the gunmen to Cryer's home, but never questioned the night club owner.

Grand jurors said last week it was Johnston's identification of Cryer that led them to indict the club owner. But Pasadena police said Johnston repeatedly told them he could not identify the assailants.

Cryer has maintained he is innocent and said the indictments were an attempt to retaliate against former Pasadena Police Chief David Millican, who once served as head of security at Gilley's.

## 2 Texans among 9 Vietnam MIAs identified

WASHINGTON — The Defense Department said Tuesday it has identified nine servicemen missing from the Vietnam War from among the 26 sets of remains turned over by Vietnamese authorities on Aug. 14. Two of the servicemen were from Texas.

"The identification process continues," Pentagon spokesman Robert B. Sims said. "These are nine who we can identify today." Identification was made at the Army's identification laboratory in Honolulu.

The Texas servicemen, their dates of birth, homes of record when lost and date missing:

Navy Cmdr. William P. Yarbrough, May 25, 1923, Abilene, Jan. 19, 1967.

Air Force Maj. William E. Jones, June 21, 1940, Fort Worth, Jan. 5, 1968.

Before the identifications, 2,464

American military personnel and civilians were listed as missing in Southeast Asia, 1,375 of them in Vietnam and the remainder in Laos and Cambodia.

The remains given to an American delegation in Hanoi on Aug. 14 brought to 99 the number the communist government has turned over.

Vietnamese authorities have said they could move faster if the United States dropped its "hostile attitude."
