Panhandle fugitive safe on Belize soil

PAMPA — A Gray County official says he is having trouble extraditing a former Panhandle businessman who is now a fugitive and believed to be setting up an aloe vera plantation in Central America.

Thomas C. Etheredge, indicted twice for the sale of illegal securities, is believed to be recruiting farmers to grow aloe vera in the Central American country of Belize. Aloe vera is a plant used mostly for medicinal purposes.

Hamilton said he has known for six weeks that Etheredge was in Belize and has been trying to extradite him to Gray County in connection with the now-closed Bethany Trust & Co.

But Hamilton said the extradition has been delayed because the Belizean government's extradition treaty never has been used.

"We were trying not to spread the story around (that he was in Belize), because we're trying to get him arrested," Hamilton said.

According to reports, Etheredge is involved in a joint venture with United Farm Industries of Belize Ltd.

Bethany Trust, which Etheredge founded in May 1984, was closed April 2 for failing to verify almost \$11.75 million in assets at the demand of the Texas Banking Commission.

Bethany officials owed \$1.3 million to about 150 investors and creditors, several from the Texas Panhandle.

Edna Read, a consulate at the American Embassy in Belize, said that federal provisions prevented her from disclosing any information about Etheredge.

"We don't discuss private citizen-sand their business here," she said.

Hamilton said he does not know how long Etheredge has been in Belize. Kim Kennedy, working with the Belize Chamber of Commerce, said Tuesday he knows Etheredge is doing business in Belize, but wouldn't comment further because he only recently learned the Texan was a fugitive.

The Belize Chamber of Commerce is trying to weed out any "less-than-desirable" projects or people spearheading those projects, said Kennedy, an official for the U.S. Aid for International Development.

Mother of reigning Miss USA finally becomes naturalized U.S. citizen

EL PASO — Seven years after her daughter was granted U.S. citizenship, the mother of Miss USA became a naturalized citizen Wednesday and said the occasion made her feel like she really belongs.

Maria Elena Martinez, 45, was one of 484 people from 30 countries to take the oath of U.S. citizenship during a special ceremony over which U.S. District Judge Harry Lee Hudspeth presided.

The majority of the new citizens are natives of Mexico as are Marti-

nez and her daughter, Laura Martinez Herring, who have lived in Texas since 1974 and in El Paso since 1978.

"I had it in my mind and in my heart to do," Martinez said of applying for citizenship. "It had just laid dormant. Now, I feel very good about it."

Herring, 21, became a U.S. citizen in 1978 when she was 14. She was crowned Miss USA in May, making her the first Hispanic and the first naturalized citizen to hold the title.

Miss USA was a guest speaker at Wednesday's ceremony, which her

mother described as "very emotional for me."

Herring told the new citizens that she did not appreciate her citizenship until she had traveled to other countries and "had something to compare it with."

Herring said that now she knows the benefits of being a U.S. citizen, citing education, freedom of speech and freedom of choice among them.

After the 30-minute ceremony, Miss USA said of her mother, "I know how happy she is. And for me, it was wonderful for me to be a part of it."

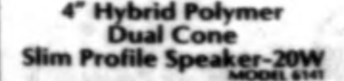
