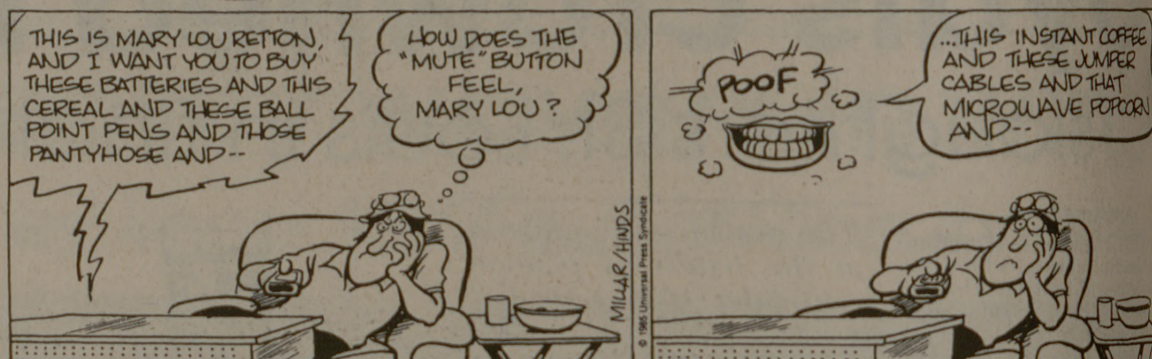

Bears will hibernate on top of SWC alone

 The Southwest Conference-leading Baylor Bears get a week of rest before meeting the Arkansas Razorbacks in what could be the showdown game of the year.
 Baylor bounced TCU, 45-0, on homecoming Saturday to increase its SWC ledger to 5-0 while Texas, the only other unbeaten team in league play, took a 44-14 strapping from SMU.

Baylor will travel to Little Rock for a night game Nov. 9 in War Memorial Stadium.

In SWC other games Saturday, Arkansas stayed in the title chase with a 57-27 massacre of the Houston Cougars and Texas A&M kept close with a 43-28 victory over the surprisingly tough Rice Owls.

The SWC spotlight game this week finds SMU at A&M in a 6:45 p.m. nationally televised matchup on ESPN.

In other games, Texas finally gets back home to entertain Texas Tech, Arkansas travels to Rice, and Houston is at TCU.

SMU gave Texas its worst whipping in the 69-year history of their series and scored more points than the Mustangs had ever posted against a Longhorn team.

"We never anticipated that it would turn out this way," said SMU Coach Bobby Collins. "I'm surprised."

The only consolation for the Longhorns was a fourth-period touchdown, their first offensive TD in 12 periods.

"So many times we had the ball inside the five and couldn't score a touchdown," said Texas linebacker

 SMU tailback Reggie Dupard scored four touchdowns for the Mustangs.

Baylor is 7-1 for the year and even Coach Baylor Grant Teaff had to admit "Right now, we're in pretty good shape," Teaff said. "But we still have a long road to travel. We've got to make two big road trips to Arkansas and Texas before this thing is decided."

Baylor rolled up 526 yards of offense against TCU and held the Frogs to only 184.

Arkansas is now 3-1 in the SWC and 6-1 overall. Houston, which appeared in last year's Cotton Bowl, is 0-4 and 1-6.

"We stunk up the place and it's obvious we aren't the same team we were last year," said Hank Wheeler, a UH assistant coach.

The 57 points were the most Arkansas since beating Tulsa 69-0 in 1974.

"I was shocked how wide our guys were," said Arkansas quarterback Mark Calcagni who ran for 161 yards and ran for a touchdown.

A&M is 5-2 and 3-1 going into a game with SMU.

"When you score 43 points and don't play well it can be frustrating," said A&M Coach Jackie Sherrill.

The Aggies' Anthony Toney had 116 yards on 25 carries.

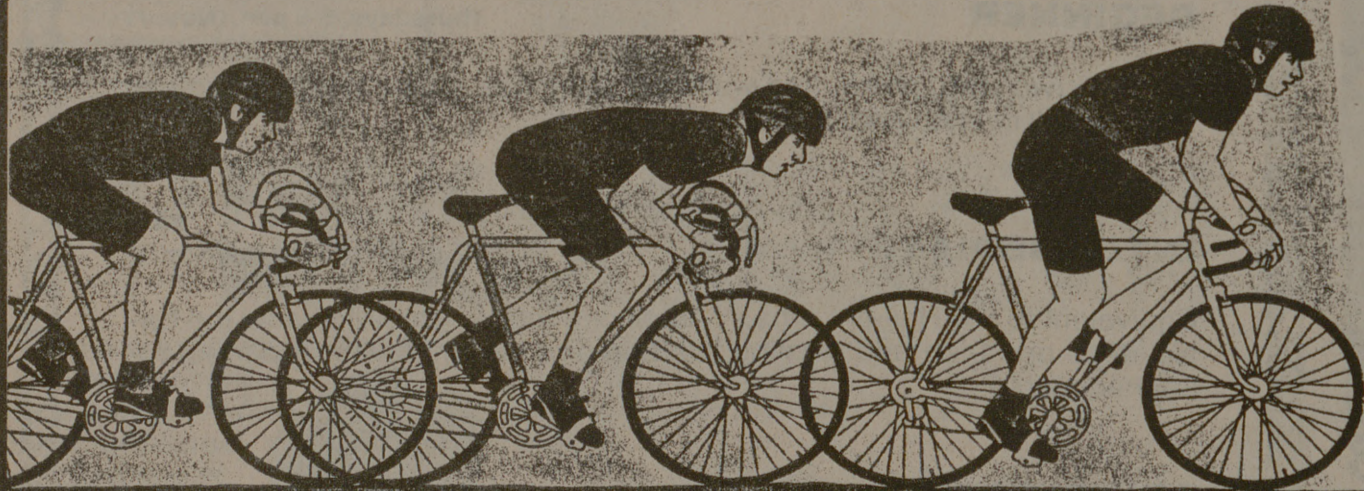
