# SG to keep open communications with Bryan Council

A Texas A&M Student Government official said he will continue to seek open communications with the Bryan City Council, even though they failed to renew the student liaison position.

Doug Baird, vice president of external affairs for Student Government, said he probably will appoint a member of his committee to attend the council meetings as an alternative to not having an officially designated liaison.

On Monday night, the council, which approved the establishment of a liaison position last year on a one-year trial basis, voted 4-3 against renewing the position for this year.

"The whole purpose of the liaison position was for public relations between the Bryan City Council and Texas A&M University," Baird said.

"I think we have to actively strive to continue those relations even though we don't have a liaison position."

At Monday's council meeting Baird presented councilmen with an outline of the reasoning behind the liaison proposal.

The outline said that a liaison position would improve communications between the University and the council.

It also said approximately 2,000 A&M students live in Bryan, affecting the businesses and supporting the city with social services.

Councilman Ben Hardeman suggested that communications could be achieved just as effectively by having a designated student regularly attend council meetings.

"We have provisions for commu-

nications going both ways with all the citizens of Bryan," Hardeman said.

"I think the opinion of the people who have spoken seems to be that there is no requirement, no need for any specific designation for your group because channels are already open for communications."

Councilman Ples Turner said, "I'm not anti-university students or anything of that nature, I just have a little concern about giving one group of citizens a benefit that we don't give to the other groups."

Assistant City Manager Marvin Norwood was called upon to clarify the privileges given to a liaison.

Norwood said the privileges are determined by the council.

He said last year's liaison was supplied with an agenda book, a reserved seat near the mayor and council at council meetings and workshop sessions, and often was called upon to comment on subjects pertinent to Texas A&M.

Generally, the liaison did not attend executive sessions of the council, he said.

Mayor Marvin Tate spoke in favor of renewing the liaison position, saying he thought the program worked smoothly last year.

The council voted 4-3 in favor of a motion to deny the Student Government request.

Turner, Hardeman, John Mobley and C.P. Vass voted to deny the request. Tate, Helen Chavarria and Hank McQuaide voted for the renewal of the liaison position.

Following the vote, Hardeman told Baird not to interpret the vote as discouraging students from regularly attending the council meetings.

"This march is giving Vietnam veterans much-needed recognition for their service to our country," White said.

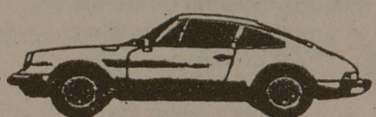

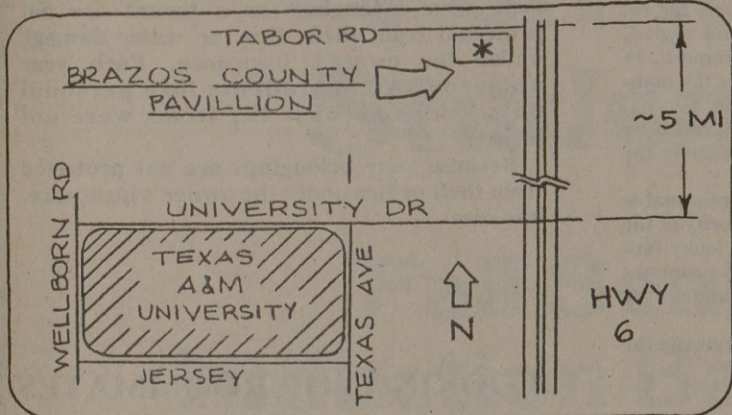
