San Antonio suffers from cold shooting

SALT LAKE CITY — San Antonio could manage only three points in the final 6½ minutes, and the Utah Jazz, behind Adrian Dantley's 33 points, came from behind to win a 102-100 National Basketball Association game here Wednesday night.
 The Spurs took a 97-88 lead with 6:40 remaining in the fourth period, but all they could manage the rest of the way was three points by center Artis Gilmore, who finished with 20 points. San Antonio forward Mike Mitchell also chipped in 20 points, while David Greenwood scored 17.
 Meanwhile, Dantley, Bobby Hansen and Jeff Wilkins were sparking the Jazz comeback.
 The Spurs had the ball with 31 seconds to go and down 102-100, but missed a chance to tie the game and send it into overtime, when they were called for a three-second violation. The Jazz inbounded the ball and held on for the two-point victory.

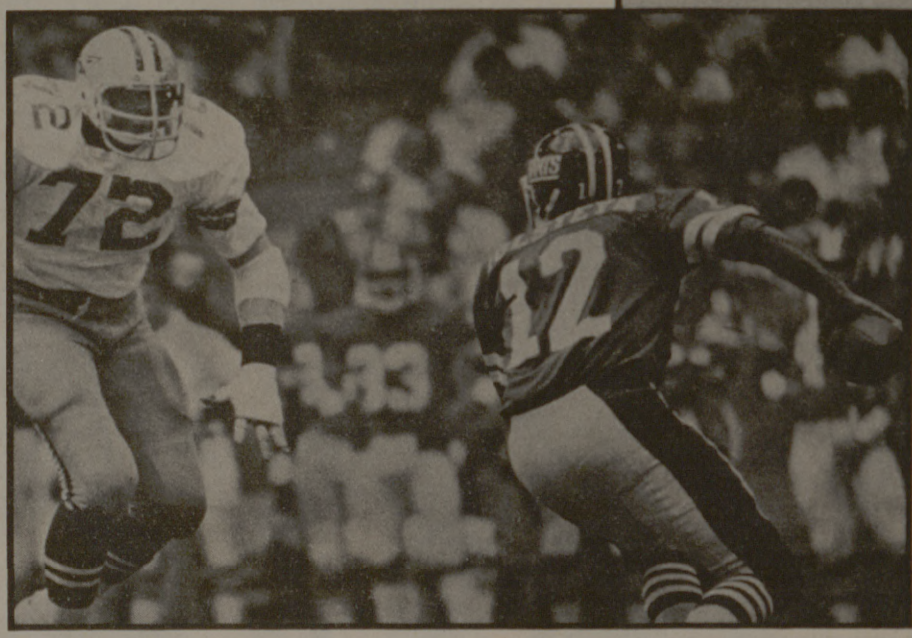
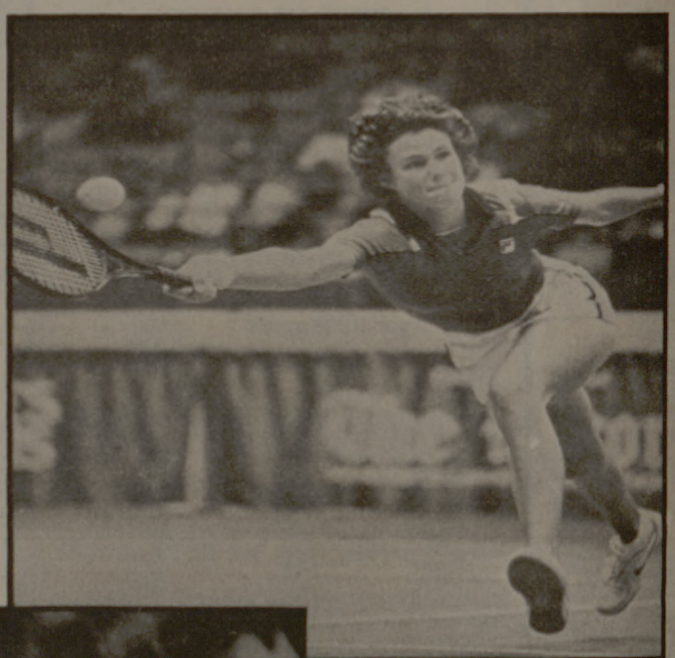

Ag women netters start ITCA tourney

The Texas A&M women's tennis team will spend Halloween but it won't be for a 6th Street bash.
 Instead, the women start play today in the Intercollegiate Tennis Coaches Association (ITCA) Regional Qualifying Tournament.
 All nine Southwest Conference schools, along with LSU, Texas Tech and Tulane, will participate in the four-day tourney held at the University of Texas' intramural tennis courts.
 A&M Women's Tennis Coach Bobby Kleinecke said the tournament exposes the Aggies to tough competition, but added, "We've got a shot well with all the doubles teams."
 A&M has two doubles teams seeded in the tourney. Kim Labuschagne and Karen Marshall are seeded third, while the tandem of Vanne Akagi and Gaye Lynne Gensler are the tournament's No. 7 seeds.
 Kleinecke said the No. 3 seeding of Labuschagne and Marshall stems from their winning the doubles championship at the Westwood Invitational Tournament in Austin three weeks ago. The tandem also won the rain-delayed Houston Fall Festival over Akagi and Gensler on Oct. 12.
 Two other A&M doubles teams will play in the tourney — Christianne-Kellie Dorman and Laura Liang-Julie Vaughan. Each of the eight players will also compete in singles action, in which senior Akagi is seeded the highest at No. 18.
 "We'll have to outsmart them (the competition) in singles," Kleinecke said. "If we use our heads and play our game, we can win some matches. We'll have to play well to do well."
 "We've got to be ready because there are good teams in this tournament."
 Each team competing in the tourney is allowed to send at least one singles player and one doubles team. Any others are invited on an at-large basis.
 The first and second place singles players and doubles teams will automatically advance to the ITCA Nationals Tournament in Houston on Nov. 6-9. Other players, who have a good showing in the regional tourney, will be invited as at-large participants in the national tournament.
 Kleinecke said this week's inclement weather forced the team to practice on Monday to practice on indoor courts.
 "The (rainy) weather probably hurt us practice-wise, but there's no affected everyone else in the state," he said.
