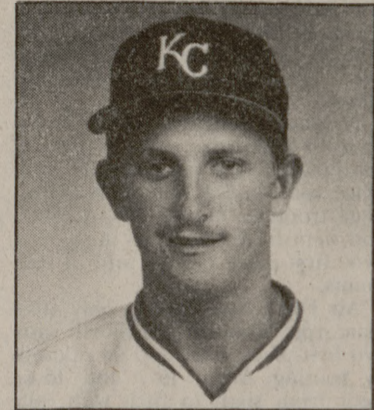

Saberhagen named AL's Cy Young winner

NEW YORK — Bret Saberhagen became the first Kansas City Royals pitcher to win the American League Cy Young Award, grabbing 23 of 28 first-place votes, the Baseball Writers Association of America announced Monday.

Saberhagen, 21, was 20-6 with a 2.87 earned run average in his second major-league season. He had 10 complete games, with one shutout, and struck out 158 in 235 innings.

The right-hander easily outdistanced New York Yankees left-hander Ron Guidry. Saberhagen, who also received four second-place votes, collected 127 points. Guidry had four first-place votes, 22 for second and was picked third on two ballots. He finished with 88 points.

Guidry was the only pitcher named on all 28 ballots — two writers from each of the AL's 14 cities. Saberhagen was not selected by Ray Sons of the Chicago Sun-Times, who had Minnesota's Bert Blyleven first, Royals reliever Dan Quisenberry second and Guidry third.

Saberhagen was the Royals' ace,

leading Kansas City's charge to the AL West title, the American League pennant and World Series. He pitched complete games to win the third and seventh games of the Series, though his postseason achievements did not figure in the voting, which was conducted prior to the playoffs.

At one point, Saberhagen won seven consecutive decisions and had

another five-game winning streak. As a rookie in 1984, Saberhagen was 10-11.

Guidry, who won the award in 1978, was 22-6 with a 3.27 ERA, two shutouts in 11 complete games and 143 strikeouts in 259 innings this year.

Guidry, 35, rebounded from the worst season of his nine-year career — he was 10-11 in 1984 — to help the Yankees finish second in the AL East. He won six of his last seven starts and had a streak in which he won 12 straight decisions.

Blyleven, the league's strikeout leader with 206, was third with 53 points. He was a combined 17-10 with a 3.16 ERA for Cleveland and the Twins, to whom he was traded in August. Blyleven had one first-place vote and four for third.

Points were awarded on a 5-3-1 basis.

Others receiving votes were Quisenberry, Charlie Leibrandt of Kansas City, Doyle Alexander of Toronto, Britt Burns of Chicago, reliever Donnie Moore of California, Toronto's Dave Stieb, and Mike Moore of Seattle.

Spurs, Mitchell nudge Nets

SAN ANTONIO — San Antonio forward Mike Mitchell was listed as doubtful going into Monday night's game against New Jersey because of a collision last week with the Philadelphia 76ers' Charles Barkley.

But it was a good thing for the Spurs that Mitchell played despite injuring his knee.

He scored 30 points and played sticky defense to lead San Antonio to a 111-104 National Basketball Association victory.

"The big key tonight was Mitch coming out and playing with that bad knee. He takes a lot of pressure off the rest of us," said Spurs forward Steve Johnson.

"Mitchell gave us a great effort. He amazes me with those knees hurting but he never misses a game," Coach Cotton Fitzsimmons added.

Mitchell, who has a history of knee injuries, said, "As long as we can run, we have a distinct advantage. It got a little physical late in the game. But that happens in the NBA. You have to expect it."

Mitchell's 18 points in the first half, combined with a defensive effort that held Nets forwards Mike O'Koren and Mike Gminski to a combined two points, helped the Spurs to a 7-point halftime margin, 54-47.

From that point on, the Nets never came closer than four points

as the Spurs boosted their record to 5-4.

The Nets offense, which has deserted them on the road, was led by guard Otis Birdsong, who finished with 27 points. All but four of Birdsong's points came in the second half, including 10 in the final period.

The Nets, 6-4, have lost all four of their road contests this season, including their first three by an average margin of 23 points.

Mitchell, who has been hobbled by a bad left knee, keyed a fourth quarter rally that iced the game for the Spurs. The 6-foot-7 forward scored four of the nine points in that streak, giving San Antonio a 13-point lead, 96-83, its largest of the game with six minutes left.

Elway rallies Broncos past 49ers

DENVER — John Elway fired a pair of first-half touchdown passes and Rich Karlis drilled a 24-yard field goal with 1:27 remaining, lifting the Denver Broncos into sole possession of first place in the AFC West with a 17-16 National Football League victory over the San Francisco 49ers Monday night.

The 49ers, trailing 14-3 at the half, used the arm of Joe Montana, the legs of Roger Craig and the foot of Ray Werschling to take a 16-14 lead with 3:46 remaining. Werschling kicked a 45-yard field goal to put San Francisco ahead for the first time.

But Denver countered with a 63-yard drive, highlighted by a pass-interference penalty on 49er safety

Dwight Hicks that covered 42 yards and a 22-yard pass from a scrambling Elway to Steve Watson — both on third down.

Denver reached the 49er 7-yard line, and Karlis connected on his second game-winning kick of the season.

San Francisco fell to 5-5 and remained three games behind the Los Angeles Rams in the NFC West.

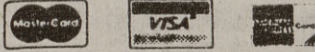

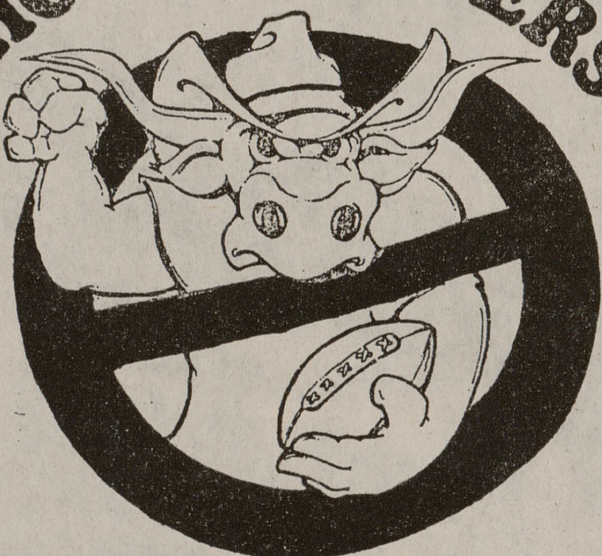

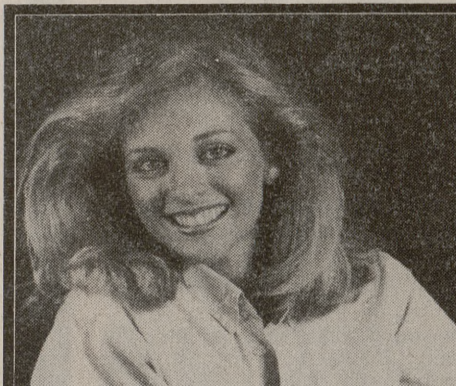
