## 5 new daily flights to D/FW available from Easterwood

American Airlines affiliate Metro Express II has begun service between Bryan-College Station and Dallas-Fort Worth Regional Airport under the American Eagle banner.

The service, which began Oct. 28, offers area travellers five daily round-trip flights between the two cities and will open connections with over 94 American Airlines destinations via the Dallas-Fort Worth hub.

Metro Express II has also begun American Eagle service to four other Texas cities this year. Other carriers associated with the new feeder system currently offer American Eagle service from cities in Texas, Louisiana, Oklahoma and Arkansas to the D/FW airport.

Although the American Eagle/Metro Express II service is a separately owned partnership affiliated with American Airlines, the new carrier will be flying under American Airlines colors.

American Eagle also is taking res-

ervations through the American Airlines reservations system, using American Airlines terminals, and its employees are trained by American personnel.

Also available through American Eagle is American Airlines' priority parcel service and door-to-door freight service.

"We're actually trained by American Airlines," said Freddie Sheets, Easterwood Airport manager for American Eagle. "We send each one of our agents through the American Airlines Learning Center in Dallas.

"This is really an extension of Dallas-Fort Worth. In other words, this ticket counter is considered to be part of American in Dallas-Fort Worth."

Flying the Easterwood-D/FW route, Metro will be using the Jetstream 31, a 19-passenger turboprop made by British Aerospace.

And Sheets says American Eagle fares are competitive with other airlines' fares in the area.

"We have both student fares and regular fares," Sheets said. "We just

had the student fares put into the system at the beginning of November. We hope that the low prices will be favorable to the students and their parents.

"We don't have any red-eye flights yet, but they're looking at the possibility."

"We also don't offer any service on the 45-minute flight to Dallas. This helps keep our costs down."

Sheets says competition between airlines seems to be a factor in such an airport.

"So far we're carrying about a 75 percent load factor," Sheets said. "In fact, all the airlines seem to be carrying 75 percent."

Texas A&M, as the owner and operator of Easterwood Airport, approved funding for extending the main runway to 7,200 feet. Construction began in September, and plans for a new terminal on the north side of the airport.

No funding has yet been appropriated for the terminal construction.

## State to begin paying for indigent care in '86

AUSTIN — House members were told Wednesday that the health care services authorized by the 1985

Legislature for low-income Texans are nearing the point where the public can see the results.

Payments to providers of indigent care services are scheduled to begin in spring or summer of 1986.

State Health Commissioner Robert Bernstein told the House Com-

mittee on Health Care Services that the Department of Health was working with all possible speed to get the two major programs approved — primary health care for indigent and maternal care for poor mothers and their babies.

More than 30 sources last year estimated that 220 homeless people would be hospitalized in the state.

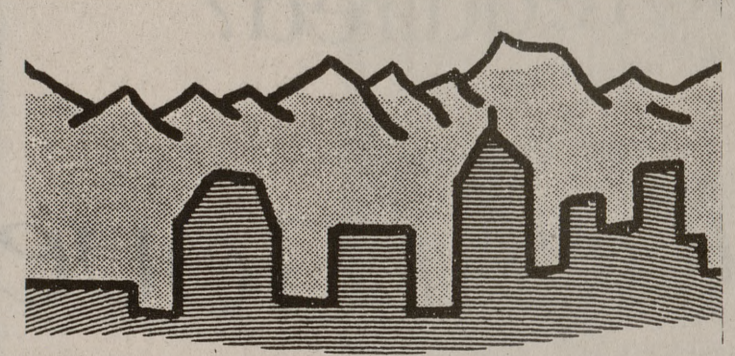
