

Mattox appoints **Hightower as** first assistant

AUSTIN - Former U.S. Congressman Jack Hightower, who has considered running again for Con-gress in 1986, accepted an appoint-ment Tuesday as first assistant attorney general of Texas. "I have been urged by many good

friends and supporters in the 13th Congressional district to run again," Hightower told a news conference after taking the oath of office. "As much as I appreciate their encour-agement, I have decided not to do

Mattox also appointed special as-sistant Mary Keller as executive as-sistant for litigation for the department overseeing all legal activities of the 231 assistant attorneys general. Mattox said she would be the first

woman to hold that position. Keller succeeds Dave Richards, who resigned to return to private practice.

Hightower, a Democrat, was elected to Congress in 1975 but was defeated in the 1984 general election by current U.S. Rep. Beau Boulter, R-Amarillo.

Like Mattox, Hightower grad-uated from Baylor University Law School. He served in the Texas House in 1953-54 and in the state Senate from 1965 through 1974. He was Wilbarger County district attor-ney from 1955 through 1961.

Keller has been a special assistant attorney general since 1983.

Embs, 56, is a candidate for the Republican nomination for the 21st congressional seat now held by Rep.
