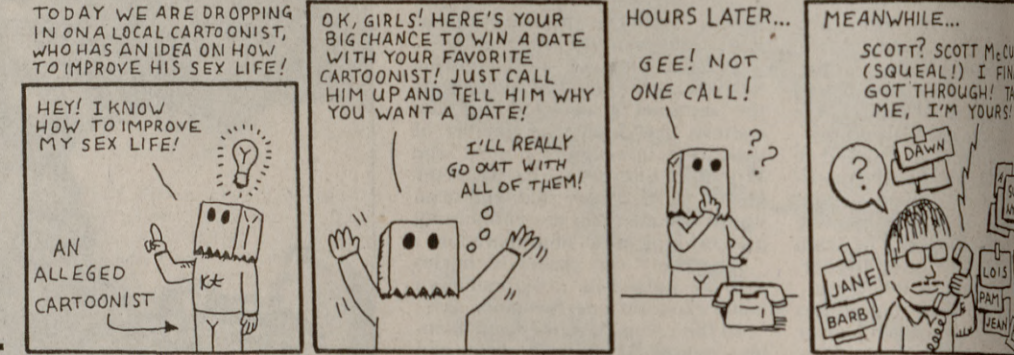

Judge blocks killer's execution

HUNTSVILLE — A federal judge Tuesday blocked the scheduled execution of convicted killer Elliot Rod Johnson just 10 hours before the Port Arthur man was to be put to death.

Johnson, 26, of Port Arthur, faced lethal injection before dawn Wednesday for the execution-style slaying of Joseph Granado, 67, during a robbery of Granado's downtown Beaumont jewelry store in

1982. Arturo Melendez, 45, of Beaumont, who worked with Granado, also was killed in the robbery.

Johnson's attorney, Sam Dunn, who was given the case by the American Civil Liberties Union, filed an appeal Tuesday with U.S. District Judge Howell Cobb in Beaumont.

Cobb issued the stay after Attorney General Jim Mattox's office agreed not to oppose the application for the order.

"The attorney general of Texas

has stated to this court that he

cedes that petitioner is entitled to a stay of execution," Cobb said in a brief decision.

"I've handled other capital cases but I haven't gone this far before," said Dunn, who has spoken with his client.

Johnson was taken by van Monday the 15 miles from his death cell at the Ellis Unit to the walls in Huntsville, arriving just 11 a.m.

Other than prison chaplain roll Pickett, he received no and was expecting none, Texas Department of Corrections spokesman Sarah Grisham said.

Johnson could select up to five witnesses his execution, chose none, she said. The inmate declined recent requests from reporters for interviews.

Assistant Warden Robert O. Johnson of the stay at 2:24 p.m. "Johnson nodded his head appeared relieved," Ott said, made no verbal comment.

The prisoner then was taken to Death Row.

The execution date was Johnson's first. Since the state resumed death penalty in 1982, only 10 inmates put to death were executed on his first date.

The state Court of Criminal Appeals rejected a request for a stay Tuesday. Last week, State Judge Leonard Giblin, who presided over the case, also rejected a stay.

"He gave a confession that he committed at the trial," David who prosecuted the case, said Monday. "What the confession was that he and Andrews went to jewelry store and pulled the evidence to put him in possession of one of the guns."
