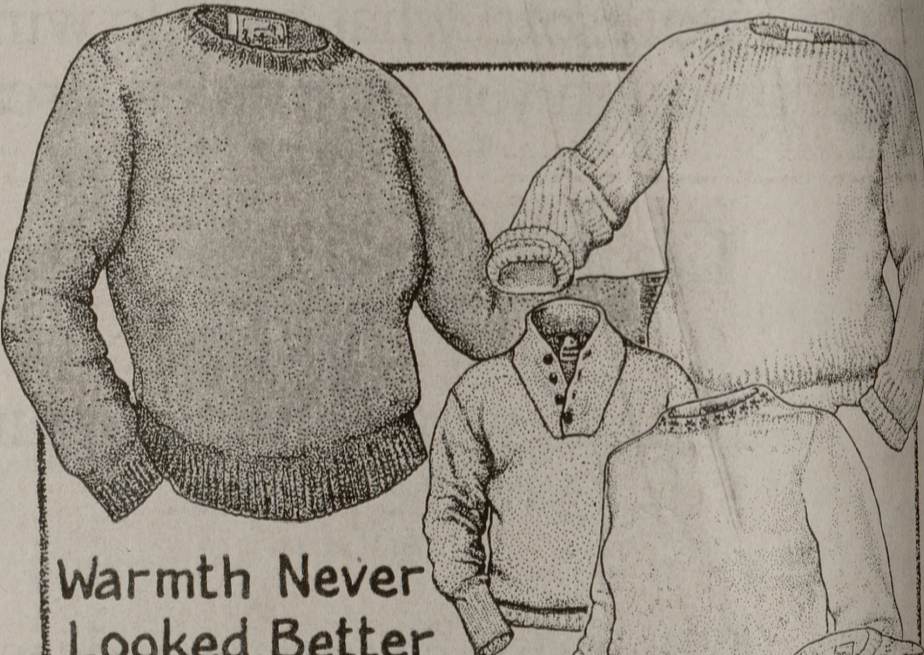
University press holds warehouse sale
