## GM unsure if call back will be issued

ARLINGTON — General Motors officials said they don't know if 350 workers, who will be laid off indefinitely on Feb. 10, will be called back to work.

Plant manager Paul Townley said Wednesday that GM will cut production by 92 cars per day at its plant here because of lagging car sales.

Layoffs and production cuts are the result of lagging sales of the Chevrolet Monte Carlo and Oldsmobile Cutlass models produced here, said Townley.

"If the market increased for the demand of the car, it could be (temporary)," Townley said.

Last week management informed workers that Arlington has been dropped from consideration to build an advanced front-wheel car called the GM 10.

About 4,500 hourly workers at the plant are represented by United Auto Workers Local 276, according to union local president John Childers. He said the union is evaluating the announcement of layoffs and exploring options.

"I certainly don't like it," Childers said. "Anytime we lose jobs, it's not only a loss to the members and their families. It's an economic loss to the community."

GM officials said the plant will continue to operate two shifts and produce 60 cars an hour but they will cut production by instituting mass relief techniques.

Mass relief calls for the complete shutdown of the line four times a day, officials said.

Individual relief allows each workers two 23-minute breaks during an eight-hour shift while the line continues to move.

Roger Bohn, general supervisor of personnel, said, "We can reduce our production this way without reshuffling all the jobs."

## Aluminum goddess to reign atop Texas' Capitol dome

AUSTIN — Texas-made aluminum will be used to cast the duplicate Goddess of Liberty that will replace the 1½-ton zinc statue that stood atop the Texas Capitol dome for 97 years, officials said Thursday.

The Alcoa Foundation of Pittsburgh, Pa., announced a grant of \$118,000 to help defray expenses of casting a new statue.

In addition, the Texas PTA on Thursday presented the state with a check for \$37,206 to help cover the costs of restoring the original, weather-damaged Goddess statue that was removed from the dome in November.

The original Goddess, which when atop the dome made the Texas Capitol several feet taller than the nation's Capitol in Washington, was removed because experts said it had become a safety hazard.

State architect Roy Graham said the duplicate statue will be an exact replica of the old Goddess, which will be repaired and put on permanent display in a protected area.

The PTA money was raised in a variety of projects after Gov. Mark White last summer called on schoolchildren to bring a quarter to school for the statue.

## Peace march Central American protesters pleased with trek's results

MEXICO CITY — Leaders of a peace march through Central America said Thursday they had "touched many peoples of this war-torn, oppressed region" during their six-week-long troubled trek.

Although the Central American march ended Thursday, a group was to travel to Washington for a demonstration Friday at the Vietnam memorial, then go to the State Department and Congress to protest U.S. policy in the region.

A final report presented here Thursday recounts the goals and problems of the march.

The report says a total of 400 people from 25 countries took part in the march, which began Dec. 10 in Panama. About 200 were seen in most of the countries.

The marchers entered Mexico from Guatemala last Friday, visited towns in the southland held a march in the capital that drew an estimated 20,000 local people.

After rock-throwing rightist groups in Costa Rica forced the march to leave ahead of schedule, it traveled to Nicaragua, where it received its warmest welcome.

In its travels in western Nicaragua, the group says in the report,

"we saw the costs of the U.S. government-led counterrevolutionary war against the leftist Sandinista government.

"We witnessed the cruel destruction of burned medical clinics, let-ridden schools, orphaned children, entire villages destroyed," says.

Although there were many problems with government critics and the group said it was unable to meet with the U.S.-backed rebels or to visit the Atlantic Ocean home of the Miskitos and an area of rebel activity.

Honduras and El Salvador refused to admit the group after it had problems in Costa Rica, but delegations went into the two countries by air.

"It is clear that the U.S. government-military acted in complete disregard with the governments of El Salvador and Honduras to prevent our march there," the report says.

"It is afraid the marchers would observe and report to the world the acts of the brutal war it is carrying out."

Political prisoners in Honduras told the delegation "that their country is occupied by U.S. military," report says.

## Officials: No conflict of interest with deal

AUSTIN — Sculptors who complained about one company's plan to produce and sell miniature replicas of the Goddess of Liberty statue could do the same thing if they accept the same guidelines, officials said Thursday.

George Bristol, executive director of the Capitol Committee which is raising funds for Capitol restoration, said there was nothing improper in the contract with Barvo Walker, a sculptor and

friend of House Speaker Gib Lewis, D-Fort Worth.

Earlier this week, it was announced that Barvo Creative Inc. — operated by Walker and Washington University Technology Associates, the state's Goddess of Liberty consultant — would be selling 21-inch replicas of the statue for \$1,836 each.

Bristol said Walker's company must market the product, pay the production costs, and it could lose money.

"This is one of Texas PTA's statewide Sesquicentennial projects," said Mary Tippin of El Paso, Texas PTA president. "By the middle of January, we had received some 424 separate donations representing thousands of Texas schoolchildren."

John Drake, Texas area manager for the Aluminum Company of America, said the Alcoa Foundation became interested in the statue when

Alcoa officials in Texas recommended a grant to cover the cost metal, casting, fabrication and sculptor's services.

Metal for the new statue will be produced and cast into small replicas at Alcoa's Rockdale Works, the company's largest smelter. It will be shipped to a Texas foundry where the copy will be made.
