Mattox, responding in a prepared statement Sunday to the Morning News story, called it "negative" and "distorted.


Mattox said he and Faulkner have been partners in several real estate

Mattox's statement described the payment as a commission for putting together a seller and buyer for 21 acres of condominium land. The deal was handled by Faulkner, the statement said.

Court documents, including Faulkner's deposition, show the money was delivered to Mattox as two cashiers checks for \$100,000 each, one of them payable to Mattox's sister and the other payable to his brother.

Mattox said he was uncertain why his sister's name appeared on one of the checks. He said the money actu-ally was intended for Mattox Properties. He said he assumes that his sister may have acted as a trustee in his behalf.
