

studies was also approved by the board.

According to William H. Clayton, president of Texas A&M at Galveston, a survey of prospective employers in the marine and maritime industries and related governmental agencies has indicated a need for graduates in this proposed program, and a concurrent survey of area high school students has indicated a desire for such a program to be offered by the university.

No similar program exists within the state, Clayton said.
