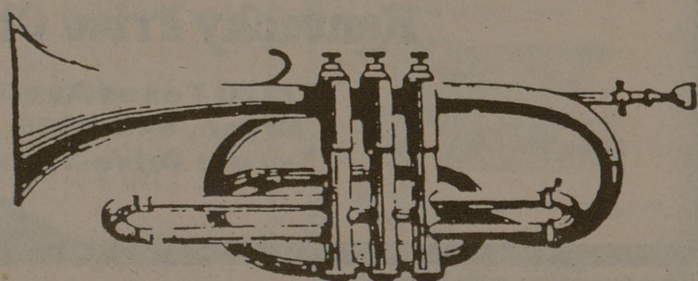

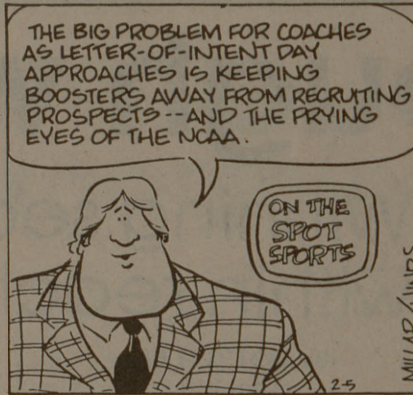

No. 1 Tar Heels squeeze by Yellow Jackets in OT

ATLANTA — Brad Daugherty sent the game into overtime with a 10-footer from the baseline and then gave top-ranked North Carolina the lead it never relinquished as the Tar Heels overcame a 13-point second-half deficit and edged No. 2 Georgia Tech 78-77 in an Atlantic Coast Conference basketball game Tuesday night.  
Joe Wolf hit four free throws in the final 46 seconds of overtime, including two that iced the game with 11 seconds left in the first meeting this season between teams ranked first and second in The Associated Press poll.  
Georgia Tech appeared to have the game under control when Mark Price sank two free throws with 11:56 remaining to give the Yellow Jackets a 59-46 lead.  
Wolf started a 9-0 run by the Tar Heels, who eventually cut the lead to two points on a 20-footer by freshman Jeff Lebo with 4:55 to play.

Lebo later drilled two free throws with 1:19 remaining to cut the lead to 69-68.  
Antoine Ford hit one of two free throws for Georgia Tech five seconds later and Daugherty closed out the regulation scoring at 70-70 with 55 seconds left.  
Price missed a 15-footer for Georgia Tech with eight seconds left in regulation and Steve Hale grabbed the rebound for North Carolina. After two timeouts, North Carolina got off two shots in the closing seconds, Kenny Smith missing an 18-footer from the left side and Lebo failing on a 10-footer from the right side as the buzzer sounded.  
After Daugherty hit a 15-foot jumper from the free-throw line, Smith made a layup to give North Carolina a 74-70 lead in the five-minute extra period.  
Duane Ferrell and Bruce Dalrymple each had rebound baskets for Georgia Tech before the overtime went into its final minute.  
Daugherty had 22 points and Hale 18 for the Tar Heels, 23-1 overall and 7-1 in the ACC.

Spurs slip by Sonics

SAN ANTONIO — Center Artis Gilmore had a game-high 30 points, including five in overtime, to pace the San Antonio Spurs to a 124-119 victory over the Seattle SuperSonics Tuesday night in National Basketball Association play.  
Seattle's Ricky Sobers had tied the game at 111 on a layup with 17 seconds left. The Spurs, who played without normal starters Johnny Moore and Steve Johnson, still had a chance to win in regulation but a late jumper by Mike Mitchell was no good.  
Gilmore took the first four points in overtime and the Spurs were never threatened after that.  
San Antonio, now 27-24, shot 61.3 percent from the field but committed 21 turnovers that led to 30 points for Seattle, which dropped to 17-32.  
The Spurs rode a 12-6 streak late in the first half to take a 61-51 lead at intermission as Gilmore scored 17 points and Mitchell added 14. They frittered away a 7-point lead in the last three minutes of regulation, while Sobers scored six points.  
Mitchell recorded his first triple double (26 points, 10 rebounds and 10 assists), and guards Wes Matthews and Alvin Robertson added 23

Wales wins NHL All-Star Game, 4-3

HARTFORD, Conn. — Brian Trottier scored the winning goal 3:05 into overtime after taking a goalmouth pass from New York Islanders teammate Mike Bossy as the Wales Conference continued its domination of the Campbell Conference with a 4-3 victory Tuesday night in the 38th National Hockey League All-Star Game.  
Bossy gathered the puck in at the blue line and skated in on the right side of Edmonton goaltender Andy Moog before sliding a pass through the legs of Oiler defenseman Paul Coffey to Trottier, who knocked in a 5-footer past Moog.  
The goal was the first in All-Star competition for Trottier, who had played in six of these previous games.  
The game featured a furious third period, including the second goal of the night by Philadelphia's Brian Propp on a power play.  
That goal gave the Wales Conference a short-lived 3-2 lead before Winnipeg center Dale Hawerth scored the tying goal for the Campbell Conference with only 43 seconds left in regulation time.
