

ATLANTA — Brad Daugherty sent the game into overtime with a 10-footer from the baseline and then gave top-ranked North Carolina the lead it never relinquished as the Tar Heels overcame a 13-point second-half deficit and edged No. 2 Georgia Tech 78-77 in an Atlantic Coast Conference basketball game Tues-

Joe Wolf hit four free throws in the final 46 seconds of overtime, including two that iced the game with 11 seconds left in the first meeting this season between teams ranked first and second in The Associated Press

Georgia Tech appeared to have the game under control when Mark Price sank two free throws with 11:56 remaining to give the Yellow Jackets a 59-46

Wolf started a 9-0 run by the Tar Heels, who eventually cut the lead to two points on a 20-footer by freshman Jeff Lebo with 4:55 to play.

The Spurs rode a 12-6 streak late in the first half to take a 61-51 lead at intermission as Gilmore scored 17 points and Mitchell added 14. They frittered away a 7-point lead in the last three minutes of regulation,
