## A&M department in first stages of planning for new building

### Reporter The Texas A&M Board of Re-

gents has approved the preparation of a plan that may provide the com-puter science department with its own building and almost five times more working space than the department has now.

A program of requirement, a doc-ument used to solicit bids from architectural firms, is being prepared by General Wesley E. Peel, vice by General Wesley E. Peel, vice chancellor of Facilities Planning and Construction.

Dr. Bruce McCormick, head of the computer science department, said the building, which is estimated to cost \$9.4 million, would be located on Spence Street between the new Civil Engineering Building and Zachry Engineering Center, if approved.

The Department of Computer Science, which has the second largest number of students in the College of Engineering, has no space for its needs or for the programmed ex-pansion of its faculty and staff, Mc-Cormick said.

"We're moving to an information and knowledge intensive society, which will provide an increasing opportunity for students majoring in computer science and computer en-gineering," McCormick said.

The expansion of faculty and staff is essential to reduce current excessive teaching overloads, and to de-

velop a vigorous program of re-search, said a report to the board. The long range plans of the de-partment include increasing substantially the number of faculty and graduate students and greatly ex-panding the departmental research base, the report said.


According to the report, the quality of other programs in the College of Engineering is being jeopardized by the current allocation of space resources.


McCormick said the Board of Regents expects his department to re-quest approval of the architectural contract in May 1986.


