

#### Two pilots grounded in landing accident

WASHINGTON — The Federal Aviation Adminstration on Thursday grounded two American Airlines pilots and a flight engineer involved in an incident in which a jetliner hit two sets of runway land-ing lights during an approach at Harlingen, and then made three more flights before the resulting damage was discovered.

The FAA said the operating certificates of the two pilots, including the captain, who was a 20-year vet-eran at American, were revoked im-

The agency said the pilots operating the Boeing 727 with 132 people, including the seven crew members on board, acted "in a careless manner" and failed to officially report the accident. The three employees were identified as Capt. John Dowds; First Officer Stephen Gall, the co-pilot who

has worked at American since 1979; and John Bonewitz, the flight engineer who was hired last October. No one was injured in the inci-dent, although officials said the im-

pact with the break-away airport lights was severe enough to cause the oxygen masks in the cabin to dis-lodge and several ceiling tiles to break away.

American Airlines spokesman John Hotard said the airline would have no comment pending the completion of its investigation except to confirm the FAA's action.

According to officials, the accident involved American Flight 844, which was trying to make a landing at Harlingen during poor weather late Friday night. After two unsuccessful landing attempts, the pilot tried a third approach and struck a support beam of approach lights about 450 feet from the beginning of the runway and another set of lights about 200 feet closer to the

The airplane was flown to San Antonio where it landed without incident and the passengers were put on buses. The plane was flown with-out passengers to Dallas-Fort Worth. The aircraft resumed its normal

flights Saturday, carrying passengers from Dallas to San Antonio, back to Dallas and on to Denver where the cockpit crew noticed mi-nor damages to the outside skin of
