Jury acquits ex-principal

LIVINGSTON — A state district court jury Wednesday acquitted a former junior high school principal of charges he killed a football coach out of jealousy over his relationship with a school secretary.

charged with murder in the April 12 killed Bill Fleming. shooting of Billy Mac Fleming, 36, who coached and taught math and science at the school.

The 10-woman, two-man jury deliberated for a total of 12.5 hours nesses, also waited in the courtroom. over two days.
