International Week
Various cultures will be featured at A&M

The International Students Association will bring food, fashion, talent and fun from countries all over the world to Texas A&M during International Week 1986.

The program, "It's a Small World, After All," will be Monday through Friday and will feature several activities and events depicting various cultures of the world.

Tina Watkins, ISA adviser said, International Week will represent over 40 international clubs, each representing a country. Events will include a cultural display, a food fair and a talent and fashion show.

"This is their (international students') opportunity to say 'This is my country,'" Watkins said.

Countries including Saudi Arabia, Guatemala, Thailand, Israel, Kenya, China, Peru, Vietnam, Lebanon and Nigeria will be represented.

Miguel Lopez, chairman of the ISA public relations committee, said the week-long event, expanded in 1980 from a single day, is a major production for the ISA, which began planning in December.

Opening ceremonies will feature Dr. John Koldus, vice president for student services, other University officials and representatives of some of the countries' consulate offices in Houston, Watkins said.

The cultural displays will be in the MSC Monday and Tuesday, Watkins said.

Children from local elementary schools are also invited to attend the display.

The food fair will be Wednesday at 6 p.m. in the MSC ballroom and will include traditional international dishes prepared by the students.

Nadim Fares, food fair coordinator, said that representatives from 28 countries each will present three authentic dishes.

"There is a big variety," Fares said. "I encourage everybody to come and try the food."

Fares said the booths will be judged on cleanliness and appearance and the food on taste.

Tickets are \$6 but are limited because of overwhelming response in past years, Watkins said.

Tickets to the talent and fashion show, to be Thursday at 8 p.m. in Rudder Auditorium, are \$2. Lina Yew, ISA coordinator for the show, said the fashion show will feature traditional costumes from 15 countries.

Claudio Carrasco, ISA adviser, said that following the fashion show will be a talent show featuring instruments and song and from about 15 countries.

Combination tickets to the fair and the talent and fashion show can be purchased for \$7.

The week's events will close with the awards ceremony party March 8. Awards will be given for the best costumes, display and talent.

Jim Lane, assistant ISA adviser, said attendance has increased over the past few years.

"We're at a point where we get any bigger," Lane said. "The cultural display takes up the floor of the MSC."

He added that the food fair requires lots of work from those who are preparing the food. Tickets must be limited to 1,000.

Tickets will be available in the MSC main hall and Rudder Auditorium.
